

**CITY OF FONTANA  
PARKS AND COMMUNITY SERVICES COMMISSION  
REGULAR MEETING  
MAY 24, 2018**

The City of Fontana Parks and Community Services Commission and Staff met for a workshop at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, May 24, 2018, in the City Council Chambers, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California, prior to the regular meeting to review the agenda, the Park Master Plan and the Co-Sponsorship applications.

**D. SUMMER PROGRAMS AND EVENT PREVIEW 2018 - NATHAN HUNT**

Community Services Supervisor Nathan Hunt provided a preview of Summer Programs and Events.

This summer the Community Services Department has something for all ages, abilities, and interests.

Summer Camps will run from June 4, 2018, through July 27, 2018, at nine locations: Jessie Turner Health and Fitness Center, Cypress Center, Heritage Center, Don Day Center, Art Depot & Steelworkers' Auditorium, Jack Bulik Center, Mary Vagle Nature Center, and Fontana Park Sports Pavilion.

In partnership with Fontana Unified School District, the Summer Food Program will be available for youth 18 years and younger free of charge at 20 sites throughout the City.

The Summer Concert Series will be held at Miller Park Amphitheater, with live music, food vendors, and family fun activities, on Thursday nights from June 7<sup>th</sup> through August 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Fontana pools will open starting May 26, 2018, for recreational swim, swim lessons, summer pool events, including Family Fun Nights, Swim-to-Win Swim Meet, Dive-In Movies, and Pool-Ooza.

The July 4<sup>th</sup> Celebration will be held at Fontana High School, with tickets on sale on June 11, 2018, at Don Day Center, Community Services Department, City Hall, and Jessie Turner Health and Fitness Center.

The Fontana Arts Festival will be held at Fontana Park, on July 28, 2018, from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Residents are encouraged to "Take a Road Trip to Fun in Fontana" to experience all of the many events and programs being offered.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

### **A. SPECIAL EVENTS UPDATE – ROB BOCK**

Community Services Supervisor Rob Bock provided a report on special events conducted in April 2018:

- **April 6, 2018, Fontana Car Show at City Hall**  
There were 102 classic cars with the band, Smokin' Cobras, entertaining with 50's hits to over 400 in attendance. Activities included a jumper and mobile recreation.
- **April 7, 2018, Veterans Resource Fair at Fontana Community Senior Center**  
This co-sponsorship event was hosted by the Veterans Partnering with Communities organization and the City of Fontana and provided housing, health, and financial resources for Veterans in Fontana. There were over 150 in attendance.
- **April 8, 2018, Walk For Kids at Fontana Park**

This was a co-sponsorship event with the Fontana Foundation for Hope, the Inland Empire Ronald McDonald House, and the City of Fontana. Over 3,000 people contributed to the success of this important fundraising campaign for the Inland Empire Ronald McDonald House.

- **April 21, 2018, Community Assistance Program Resource Fair at Jack Bulik Park**

This 15<sup>th</sup> annual event was a Co-Sponsorship event with the Community Assistance Program through the Water of Life Church. Forty-six community assistance organizations serviced over 150 residents with information on disability programs, education programs, health services, financial services, medical services and more.

## **B. SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM PREVIEW - KAREN GERBER**

Community Services Supervisor Karen Gerber provided a preview of the Summer Lunch Program.

The Summer Lunch Program is a partnership between The City of Fontana, Community Services Department and the Fontana Unified School District (FUSD) to provide free lunches to the community's youth, ages 18 and under.

The Summer Lunch Program will be held at Beech Elementary, Redwood Elementary, A.B. Miller High School, Fontana High School, Jurupa Hills High School, Kaiser High School, Summit High School, Primrose Elementary, Bill Martin Park, Fontana Park Aquatic Center, Jack Bulik Park, Miller Park, North Tamarind Park, Seville Park, Southridge Park, Veterans Park, the Lewis Library & Technology Center, and the Fontana Boys & Girls Club.

City of Fontana Summer Day Camp enrollees at Nature Discover Camp at Mary Vagle Nature Center; Summer Art Camp at Art Depot; Sports Camp at Fontana Park; Jr. Lifeguard Camp at Don Day, Miller Pool and Fontana Park; Teen Camp & Jr. Teen Camp at Jack Bulik Neighborhood Center; Camp Southridge at Don Day Neighborhood Center;

Camp Imagination at Cypress Neighborhood Center; Camp JED at Heritage Neighborhood Center; and Camp Fit at Jessie Turner Health & Fitness Center will also receive lunch and snack through the Summer Food Program at no additional cost.

There is no eligibility verification required to receive a free lunch and snack and is available to youth 18 years of age or younger with all meals meeting and exceeding the State of California SB-12 School Nutrition Standards.

### **C. KFON ANNUAL REPORT - ANTHONY SARINANA**

Community Services Production Coordinator Anthony Sarinana provided an update on KFON TV programming and services.

The Audio Visual Production Division is responsible for the City's Cable Television channel, KFON, which includes daily programming, maintaining the community bulletin board, live video recording and replay of all public meetings and to provide audio-visual support to special events, ground breaking and grand opening ceremonies and various community activities.

In 2017 KFON produced 155 productions and covered community events. State of the City, Arbor Day, Relay for Life, Fontana Days Run and City parades.

In collaboration with Mayor Acquanetta Warren, KFON produced 26 episodes each of 'Fontana's Open for Business' and 'Local Matters' programs.

Through a partnership with Healthy Fontana, 12 episodes of "Eat Healthy! Fontana" have been completed.

In collaboration with the Fontana Herald News, "Focus On Fontana" was brought back into production.

KFON offers a production internship program that allows students an opportunity to learn about the television production field. Last year, KFON hosted eight interns.

The KFON mobile production truck covers community events with a multi-camera production with high definition capabilities and has self-sustained power through a generator and inverter.

In addition to the KFON channel productions, staff continues to focus on digital communications using social media

Staff currently updates and maintains the KFON webpage on the City website which incorporates a video player link to the official City of Fontana You Tube page. The link will allow the viewing of original programming and watch KFON streaming on the web.

Uploaded short 30-second videos provide information regarding City events, news and programs; Facebook, Twitter and Instagram are used also to bring awareness.

KFON-TV Channels and On Demand are available on Spectrum Cable Channel 3, Frontier Communications Channel 38, AT&T U-Verse Channel 99 and KFON.org
