The Regular Meeting of the City of Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, July 24, 2012, in the Grover W. Taylor Council Chambers, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, CA. Mayor Warren called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Mayor Warren, Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, Council Members Slowik, Tahan and Wibert.

Absent: None.

INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Following the Invocation given by Fontana Police Department Chaplain Pastor Brian Snowball, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Pro Tem Roberts.

CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT:

City Attorney Jeff Ballinger announced that there was no reportable action taken on the Closed Session item held earlier this evening.

PROCLAMATIONS:

A. National Night Out Proclamation

B. Authorize Amendment No. 1 to the Construction Management Contract for the I-15/Duncan Canyon Interchange

Authorize the City Manager to execute Amendment No. 1 to the Construction Management Contract SP-10-DE-12 with Caldrop Corporation for Construction Management Services for the I-15/Duncan Canyon Interchange Project in accordance with Bid Schedule #3, for an increase of \$2,704,966.93 and a total not-to-exceed amount of \$2,905,196.21.

Strategic Transportation Engineering Manager Kevin Ryan and Senior Engineer Noel Castillo provided the Staff Report.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on whether the proposed contract allows the City to subsidize City staff with consultant staff.

Strategic Transportation Engineering Manager Kevin Ryan stated the proposed contract does not allow the City to subsidize City staff with consultant staff, however there are termination clauses in the contract that allow the City to terminate any part or all of the contract for any reason.

Council Member Tahan requested staff to include in the proposed contract an option to use City resources in the event of City financial hardships.

C. Award a Construction Contract for Merrill Avenue at Mango Avenue Traffic Signal and Street Improvement Project

1. Authorize the City Manager to execute a construction contract with Competitive Edge Electric Inc. for the construction of the Merrill Avenue at Mango Avenue Traffic Signal and Street Improvement Project in the amount of \$164,816.00 and authorize a 10% contingency in the amount of \$16,481.60 (Bid No. SB-46-DE-12).

Mayor Warren opened public hearing item PH-A, Items "1, 3, 4 and 5".

Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks and Senior Accountant Jeff Moriarty provided the staff report.

No written communications were received.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

The hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Wibert, seconded by Council Member Tahan, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to

1. Adopt **Resolution No. 2012-074**, of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, Confirming a Diagram and Assessment, and Levying the Assessment for Landscape Maintenance District No. 1 ("LMD #1" throughout the City) for Fiscal Year 2012-2013.

Mayor Pro Tem Roberts opened public hearing item PH-A, Item "2".

Mayor Warren and Council Member Tahan excused themselves from voting and left the room during the discussion.

Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks and Senior Accountant Jeff Moriarty provided the staff report.

No written communications were received.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

The hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Wibert, seconded by Council Member Slowik, and passed by a vote of 3-0-2 (Mayor Warren and Council Member Tahan abstained from voting, left the room during the discussion) to:

2. Adopt **Resolution No. 2012-075**, of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, Confirming a Diagram and Assessment, and Levying the Assessment for Landscape Maintenance District No. 2 ("LMD #2" Village of Heritage) for Fiscal Year 2012-2013.

B. Hearing was opened to consider Municipal Code Amendment 12-001 amending various sections of the Zoning and Development Code (Chapter 30)

Director of Community Development Don Williams and Senior Planner Stephanie Hall provided the staff report.

One written communication was received from SheppardMullin, LLP, concerning the adoption of the proposed ordinance.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on the cost difference for the property owner, between the old fence and the new fence criteria as depicted in the PowerPoint presentation.

Senior Planner Hall stated the Administrative Site Plan application is approximately \$3,000 - \$4,000. Administrative Site Plan application is typically for the construction of a project.

Director of Community Development Williams stated currently wrought iron fencing is not allowed by the code. The proposed amendment will allow property owners to construct permanent fencing (wrought iron, tubular steel or solid wall) on vacant properties. The proposed amendment will require a thorough review by City departments to verify and insure that the requests are in compliance with all applicable codes and regulations.

Council Member Tahan asked what the time line would be for the permanent

fencing Administrative Site Plan application.

Director Williams stated the time line will be approximately sixty days and will depend on the case load and the noticing requirements.

Council Member Tahan requested that the permanent fencing Administrative Site Plan application time line be simplified and shortened.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on the proposed third amendment to Section 30-301.18 regarding Auto Center Gateway signs.

Director Williams clarified that one temporary sign will be permitted at each of the two Gateway entrances, one located at the northwest corner of Sierra Avenue and South Highland Avenue and one at the northeast corner of Citrus Avenue and South Highland Avenue. Signs will be paid for by the property owner.

Council Member Tahan concluded by stating his concerns regarding the development permitting process, fees and timeline and requested that staff look into reducing the permit processing time. Ultimately our aim should be to expedite the process without compromising safety.

Mayor Warren requested clarification on the sixty day application processing time line, and asked if the need to have the permanent fencing Administrative Site Plan application be reviewed by the Police and Fire departments was relative to the code safety criteria.

Director Williams stated that the permanent fencing (wrought iron, tubular steel or solid wall) would require Public Works, Police and Fire departments review in terms of property lines, right-of-way, traffic and lines of sight. Director Williams outlined the Administrative Site Plan application process and stated the process depends on the case load, applicant's response to comments, and noticing as required by State.

Council Member Slowik commented on Mayor Warren and Council Member Tahan's request to shorten the Administrative Site Plan application process relative to discretionary versus administrative item approvals.

Dan Bane, representing SheppardMullins LLP, commented on the proposed ordinance to amend Municipal Code 12-001 and stated the Administrative Site Plan provisions are counterproductive to the City Council goals of promoting businesses.

Mayor Warren concurred with Council Member Tahan's request for a simplified and realistic application process and requested that a subcommittee of herself

and Council Member Tahan be established to have a dialogue with the business community and work with staff to bring back recommendations regarding the proposed amendments.

The hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Tahan, seconded by Council Member Wibert, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to:

1. Find that the project has been reviewed pursuant to Section No. 15070 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), adopt a Negative Declaration and direct staff to file the Notice of Determination.

2. Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1666**, an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, amending various sections of Chapter 30 of the Zoning and Development Code as follows: Revising Article I (General Provisions), Section 30-4, to establish new findings and criteria for the approval of other uses to be determined by the Director of Community Development; An amendment to Article III (Design and Administrative Site Plan Review), Section 30-113, establishing additional categories for projects requiring administrative site plan review; An amendment to Article IX (Overlay Districts), Section 30-301.18, allowing temporary auto center gateway signs, and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.

City Council requested “An amendment to Article III (Design and Administrative Site Plan Review), Section 30-113, establishing additional categories for projects requiring administrative site plan review” and Section 4 of the proposed ordinance be removed for more research and discussion.

C. Hearing was opened to consider an amendment to the General Plan and Municipal Code adding language to allow for an Overlay District for warehousing distribution/logistics uses

Director of Community Development Don Williams and Assistant Planner Arely Monarez provided the staff report.

No written communications were received.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

Discussion was held regarding the following issues: Impact of the Warehousing Distribution/Logistic Overlay District on the properties west of Sierra Avenue and the General Commercial C-2 property east of Sierra Avenue; construction of, and to, Mango Avenue from Casmalia Avenue to Summit Avenue prior to establishment of any proposed project-level development; truck routes; quality of development, Noise, Traffic , Land Use and Aesthetics.

Council Member Wibert thanked Neighborhood Watch Captain Amy Gonzales for hosting the neighborhood project discussion meeting.

Louie Zawahri, representing Fontana residents in Sierra Lakes stated residents are concerned about the noise and traffic and wanted assurance from the City that Mango Avenue will be constructed for truck use.

Director Williams clarified Mango Avenue will be constructed prior to the issuance of the project certificate of occupancy.

The hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Tahan, seconded by Council Member Slowik, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to

1. Find that the project has been reviewed pursuant to Section No. 15070 (Decision to Prepare a Negative or Mitigated Negative Declaration) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), adopt a Negative Declaration and direct staff to file the Notice of Determination.
2. Adopt **Resolution No. 2012-079**, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, approving General Plan Amendment No. 12-004, an amendment to the General Plan Land Use Element (Chapter 3), adding language to allow for warehousing distribution/logistics uses.
3. Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1667**, an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, approving Municipal Code Amendment No. 12-003, an amendment to Chapter 30 (Zoning and Development Code), Article IX (Overlay Districts), adding the Warehousing Distribution/Logistics Overlay District and its development regulations, and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.

D. Hearing was opened to consider a Zone Change No. 11-017, an amendment to the City of Fontana Zoning District Map to add the Warehousing Distribution/Logistic Overlay District to the property located near the northeast corner of Summit and Sierra Avenues

Director of Community Development Don Williams and Associate Planner DiTanyon Johnson provided the staff report.

No written communications were received.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

The hearing was closed.

Member Tahan, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to:

Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1668** an Ordinance of the City of Fontana approving Zone Change No. 11-017, amending the Zoning District Map to add the Warehousing Distribution/Logistics Overlay to approximately 36 acres of property (APNs: 0239-161-16, -23,-25,-26, and -43); and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.
