Closed Session was held on Tuesday, August 11, 2015, 6:00 p.m., in the City Hall Executive Conference Room at 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California, with Mayor Warren, Mayor Pro Tem Tahan, Council Members Roberts, Salazar-Wibert and Sandoval present.

CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL:

A. 7:00 P.M. Call the Meeting to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, August 11, 2015, in the Grover W. Taylor Council Chambers at 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. Mayor Warren called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Mayor Warren, Mayor Pro Tem Tahan and Council Members Roberts, Salazar-Wibert and Sandoval.

Absent: None.

INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Following the Invocation by Council Member Roberts, the Pledge of Allegiance was lead by Council Member Salazar-Wibert.

CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT:

City Attorney Ballinger announced that the City Council, on a vote of 5-0, moved to consider a conference with Legal Counsel regarding significant exposure to litigation. There were no reportable actions on the Closed Session Items.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

A. Artist Recognition

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized Mr. Aeron Brown as the artist in the Artist Showcase. Community Services Coordinator Ana Casillasto introduced Mr. Brown, who was present to accept. Mr. Brown thanked the Mayor and the City Council for their support of the arts.

B. Fontana Days Run Sponsors

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized Sponsors of the Fontana Days Run. Community Services Coordinator Bianca Morales introduced the contributing sponsors: Fontana Water Company (present to accept); Caremore (present to accept); Manheim Southern California Auto Auction; Kaiser Permanente; San Antonio Regional Hospital; and Massage Envy.

C. Police Department Employee of the Month

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized Officer Brad Ubovich as the Police Department's April Employee of the Month. Police Chief Jones introduced Officer Ubovich, who was present to accept.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:

A. Public Communications

Mr. Danny and Lori Perales, Calvary Chapel-Summit Church, announced that their church recently moved from Juniper Avenue and Foothill Boulevard to 7970 Cherry Avenue (near Winco) in Fontana. The contact number provided was (909) 320-7350. Sunday services to be held at 10:00 a.m. at Summit High School, 11555 Summit Avenue in Fontana. Mr. Perales invited everyone to visit Calvary Chapel and provided information on the many services and programs that were offered by the church.

Mr. Marcell Vargas, Boy Scouts of America, invited everyone to the Distinguished Citizen Dinner honoring Mayor Warren to be held on Thursday, September 17, 2015, Sierra Lakes Country Club, at 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Idilio Sanchez, Fontana Chamber of Commerce, thanked Mayor Warren, Mayor Pro Tem Tahan and Council Member Salazar-Wibert for attending their Mid-Year Retreat and thanked the Mayor and City Council for their support.

Ms. Beth Connors, Fontana resident, addressed the Westgate project and stated that the community was saying that they did not mind that they develop R-1 but they had a problem changing the zoning. Ms. Connors asked that the Mayor listen to the people that had voted for her and represent their interests.

Mr. Sean Ponce, Freedom Tea Party Patriots, spoke on the Westgate project and stated that he had 2,300 signatures against the high density project of 964 acres that Westgate wanted to develop. Mr. Ponce stated that they were not against the Westgate project, but did not want the high density because it would turn into Section 8 housing and turn into San Bernardino and go bankrupt. Mr. Ponce added that if the Westgate project were developed gang members, prostitution and drugs would move in.

Mr. Greg Brittain, Freedom Tea Party Patriots, stated that Huntington Beach Planning Commissioner Mike Hostason was a guest on his show Unite I.E. and explained that with the Obama Administration's new fair housing program, that if a City took federal grant funding at this point, the City would lose their control over local government to whatever the bureaucracy thought was fair housing. Mr. Brittain urged the City Council to read the fine print and make sure that they were not obligating the City to something that they did not want to be obligated to.

Mr. Bill Waddingham read a quotation into the record as follows: "I have come to the frightening conclusion that I am the decisive element. It is my personal approach that creates the climate. It is my daily mood that makes the weather. I possess tremendous power to make my life miserable or joyous. I can be a tool for torture or an instrument of inspiration. I can humiliate, humor, hurt or heal. In all situations, it is my response that decides whether a crisis is escalated or de-escalated and a person is humanized or de-humanized."

CONSENT CALENDAR:

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Sandoval, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Tahan, and passed by a vote of 5-0 to approve Consent Calendar Items "A-C" with correction to the minutes as noted (AYES: Warren, Roberts, Tahan, Salazar-Wibert and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

A. Approval of Minutes

Approve the Minutes of the July 28, 2015 Regular City Council Meeting.

Corrections were noted by Mayor Pro Tem Tahan to add the time line to his discussion regarding the appointments to the SANBAG Board of Directors as follows: "that perhaps the Council could wait until 2016, in seven or eight months, to bring the matter back for discussion."

Corrections were noted by Council Member Salazar-Wibert to add to her discussion regarding appointments to SANBAG as follows: "that she stated that in hopes that Mayor Warren and Mayor Pro Tem Tahan could possibly have a healthy conversation regarding this and bring back a resolution at the next Council meeting."

B. Adoption of Ordinance No. 1731

Second Reading/ Adopt **Ordinance No. 1731**, an Ordinance of the City of Fontana approving Zone Change No. 14-009, a zone change to the Zoning District Map to change approximately 3.5 adjusted gross acres of property (APN 1110-391-03) from General Commercial (C-2), to Medium Density Residential (R-2), located at 15634 Foothill Boulevard (north of Foothill Boulevard and east of Lime Avenue).

C. Final Acceptance of "Sierra Crest Park" (Park "A") for Tract No. 18820

Accept as complete "Sierra Crest Park" (Park "A") located within Tract No. 18820 in the Sierra Crest development, north of Terra Vista Drive on the east side of Condor Avenue.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A. Zone Change No. 14-007 and Tentative Tract Map No. 14-005 (TT #18987) Located on the Southeast Corner of Sierra Lakes Parkway and San Sevaive Road

Development Services Deputy City Manager Debbie Brazill and Senior Planner Orlando Hernandez provided the staff report.

Deputy City Manager Brazill stated that the applicant had submitted a letter in

support of staff's recommendation and was interested in resubmitting the map for 5,000 square foot lots. Ms. Brazill stated that staff had brought forward a little used municipal code that permitted the City Council to act as the Planning Commission in order to save the applicant time, and in this case, about 60 days.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

Mayor Warren stated that this motion was for reconsideration and someone who had voted for in the majority needed to put the motion forward. Mayor Warren read the verbiage for the motion into the record as follows:

"I believe that the Council's action on this zone change and tract map from the last meeting should be reconsidered. Therefore, I move for Council reconsideration of the Council's prior action on this zone change and tract map."

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that at the last meeting he had offered the applicant continuance of the item; therefore, he would make the second on the motion.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Roberts, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Tahan, and passed by a vote of 5-0 to approve the reconsideration as noted (AYES: Warren, Roberts, Tahan, Salazar-Wibert and Sandoval; NOES: None).

Mayor Warren asked what was the Council's pleasure as to how the applicant and staff should proceed. Mayor Warren read the verbiage in the record as follows:

"I would move that the zone change and tract map be sent back to staff for a redesign in compliance with all of the City's new R-2 standards, including the 5,000 square foot minimum lot size. This motion would include that this matter come back to the Planning Commission and then to the City Council for final action."

ACTION: Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Tahan, seconded by Council Member Salazar-Wibert, and passed by a vote of 5-0 to approve the motion as noted (AYES: Warren, Roberts, Tahan, Salazar-Wibert and Sandoval; NOES: None).

NEW BUSINESS:

A. Adoption of an Ordinance Adding Sections 5-602 through 5-608 to Article XX of Chapter 5 to the City of Fontana Municipal Code to Create an Expedited Permitting Process for Small Residential Rooftop Solar Systems

Mr. Gil Estrada, Building Official, provided the staff report.

Mayor Warren inquired about whether the various vendors that were providing the service in the City were required to have a business license.

Building Official Estrada stated that they were required to have a business license.

Mayor Warren asked how many vendors that provided the service had a business license.

Building Official Estrada stated that he would come back with the information to respond to this inquiry.

Mayor Warren stated that a citizen had read the agenda on this item and was concerned about better business practices. Mayor Warren added that there had been a lot of publicity lately on solar panels and how they actually worked and how they can be deeded to a home. Mayor Warren asked whether this type of information was provided when they came in for a permit or was that something that they did on their own.

Building Official Estrada stated that was something that was dealt with on the private side and staff did not deal with informing the public on all the matters that might occur.

Mayor Warren asked whether staff referred anyone to a particular company.

Building Official Estrada stated that staff does not.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan asked that when people called the City was staff providing information that was available on the market, such as, funding programs. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that SANBAG had the HERO program, which was partnered with other agencies. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan asked whether information was being provided to residents regarding the solar program.

Building Official Estrada stated that if a resident asked for that information that staff may refer them to those particular programs, but generally did not have advertisements at the front counter.

Mayor Warren stated that for the HERO program there had been an extensive outreach program, and this particular action was about a resident coming in after they had contracted with a vendor.

City Manager Ken Hunt stated that the information was on the City's website and the City supported the SANBAG Hero and PACE programs. Mr. Hunt stated that the information was on the City's website and was available, and when calls were received, staff could refer them to the information and

contact numbers.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Salazar-Wibert, seconded by Council Member Sandoval, and passed by a vote of 5-0 to approve New Business Item NB-A (AYES: Warren, Roberts, Tahan, Salazar-Wibert and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

1. Determine that pursuant to Section 15378 of the California Environmental Quality Act, the proposed ordinance does not constitute a project and has no potential for resulting in physical change in the environment, directly or indirectly, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption.

2. Introduce and waive further reading of **Ordinance No. 1732**, an Ordinance of the City of Fontana adding Sections 5-602 through 5-608 to Article XX of Chapter 5 of the Fontana Municipal Code to Provide an Expedited Permitting Process for Small Residential Rooftop Solar Systems, and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.

ELECTED OFFICIALS COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS:

A. Appointments to San Bernardino County Association of Governments (SANBAG) Board of Directors

Mayor Warren opened the discussion regarding appointments to the San Bernardino Association of Governments (SANBAG) Board of Directors. Mayor Warren stated that she had asked that this item come back to the City Council to ask for the Council's support, to replace Mayor Pro Tem Tahan as the representative on SANBAG with herself as the representative.

Mayor Warren referred to Council Member Sandoval's previous comments that he felt that it was imperative that people that serve on these boards bring the information back to Council, so that the information could be vetted, discussed and everyone had a clear understanding of what the issues were. Mayor Warren apologized to Council Member Sandoval and that he was absolutely right that reports should come back to all of the Council, as to what the activities were. Mayor Warren announced that going forward, if selected, she would bring the information back before she returned to that decision making body, and would make sure that everyone was clear on what the issues were as to the regional efforts.

Mayor Warren inquired whether Council Member Salazar-Wibert had her questions answered regarding SANBAG.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert stated that her questions had been answered. Mrs. Salazar-Wibert stated that she had received a book from the SANBAG director and there had been some confusion as to who served on

the SANBAG board. Mrs. Salazar-Wibert stated that the information stated that Mayors usually served on it, but at this point on SANBAG, there were ten council members and 14 mayors.

Mayor Warren inquired whether Council Member Salazar-Wibert was ready to make a decision.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert stated that she had a chance to research the information and she was ready to make a decision.

Mayor Warren provided the reasons as to why a change was needed, and added that getting Ontario Airport back was huge and the City was on the move and was ready to be an important player regionally, and that Fontana should receive what it was entitled to. Mayor Warren stated that she had a lot of experience regionally and tried to create great relationships with all the electeds and with all the cities. Mayor Warren stated everyone was not always going to agree but the City was ready to move the community forward.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated for clarification that the question on reporting was why SANBAG presented to the Council over the last four years--twice at a workshop and once or twice at a Council meeting--and staff reports on items on the agenda and reports are also received from City Manager Hunt, and there was always discussion on critical issues. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that he still believed he was the best fit for the SANBAG assignment. He added that he had been on SANBAG and had watched them since 1998 as a business person and consultant, and had seen several changes in CEOs (Chief Executive Officers), such as, Mr. Eric Haley, Mr. Norm King and Ms. Deborah Barmack. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that he understood the process and challenges and had done a great job, and did not know why something that was not broken had to be fixed.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert thanked those who had contacted her and provided more information on the process; their comments and advice helped enlighten her. Mrs. Salazar-Wibert hoped that this situation would not divide the Council and the community needed a cohesive Council that remembered every citizen.

Mayor Warren stated that the relationship with SANBAG was very fragmented and the City could not obtain the respect level if the present representation continued. Mayor Warren added that the "line in the sand" did not work with regional boards, and that it was time to come together to support the majority. Mayor Warren asked for Council support again and called for a motion.

Ms. Tressy Capps, Fontana resident and head of Toll Free I.E. reiterated that Mr. Tahan would be the best representative on SANBAG for several reasons:

1) Mr. Tahan had been on SANBAG since 2011 and was very familiar with the toll lane issue; 2) Mr. Tahan had been working on this issue for several years and had the background and used to be with Caltrans; 3) Toll lanes are not a done deal and there were three options on the table; and 4) In response to her public records request, an extensive email was received from SANBAG and it did not show anything about his service that was in question. Ms. Capps strongly encouraged the Council to let Mr. Tahan finish up to the EIR (environmental impact report) stage. Ms. Capps complained about SANBAG's voting record, board members receiving \$400 a meeting, and Mayor Warren attending a SANBAG meeting, not paying attention, and leaving early. Ms. Capps stated that Mr. Tahan did a really good job. Ms. Capps stated that this was not a personality contest but was about who was going to be the best representative for the City and who understood the issue. Ms. Capps added that she was very confident that Mr. Tahan was the person and not the Mayor.

Mr. Sean Ponce, Freedom Tea Party Patriots, stated that the people did not need to be taxed with a billion dollar project. Mr. Ponce hoped that Mr. Tahan would be kept on SANBAG so that he could continue to vote no.

Ms. Kathy Ponce, Freedom Tea Party Patriots, stated that the City Council was great and brought things so unique to the council because of their unique personalities, but did not deal well with opposition. Ms. Ponce stated that they were present to support the community and be issue-based and it was not a popularity contest.

Mr. Raymond Herrera, Freedom Tea Party Patriots, spoke on the appointments to SANBAG and stated that he supported Mayor Pro Tem Tahan.

Mr. Greg Brittain, Freedom Tea Party Patriots, stated that SANBAG was a regional government and was not directly elected by the people but had power over them. Mr. Brittain stated that it was especially important that the representatives from various cities be mindful of representing their constituents. Mr. Brittain stated that the Council wanted to get Mr. Tahan off SANBAG because he was not against the Board's wishes. He added that toll roads was a way to extract more money from the taxpayer, and commended Mr. Tahan for opposing the toll road.

Mayor Warren stated that this was not just about toll roads but about other issues as well. Mayor Warren stated that there were other projects that had occurred that were a result of going to SANBAG, and it was up to the Council to continue those projects. Mayor Warren stated that if a good relationship with SANBAG was not created, we cannot move forward.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that four interchanges had been built since he had been on SANBAG, such as, Citrus/I-10, Cherry/I-10, Baseline/I-15 and

Duncan Canyon. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan added that funding for these projects had been difficult but he had successfully argued before SANBAG for the funding. He added that we kept going back and arguing and got lucky with the CDC. He stated that we had to work with our regional partners and had done a great job at the regional level. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that he understood the Council's concerns and that when this particular issue came forward, he would be happy to bring it back to the Council.

Mayor Warren called for a motion and none was presented.

Mayor Warren stated that she would like to find out whether she would be considered to be the representative and when.

Council Member Roberts stated that the Council had given direction to anyone who was the SANBAG representative. Mr. Roberts stated that he was the alternate representative and was the regular representative before Mayor Pro Tem Tahan had been selected. Mr. Roberts stated that based on Mayor Pro Tem Tahan's transportation experience he was chosen to represent the City because of the technical expertise. Mr. Roberts stated that SANBAG was originally made for Mayors--24 cities and five members of the Board of Supervisors--but did not like the make up of SANBAG, because it was based on population of a city, and could easily be out voted by a city the size of Grand Terrace or Montclair. Mr. Roberts stated that he did not have a problem with rotating the positions on all the boards and it was good to have that exposure and experience.

Mayor Warren announced that she would consider being the alternate.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert stated that she agreed with Council Member Roberts' comments and with the Mayor as alternate.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that perhaps a change over could occur in December 2016.

Mayor Warren stated that she would be comfortable with March 2016.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan stated that he was trying to find a solution and possibly leave the change for the end of 2016, because the decision on the express lanes would be during the Summer or Fall of 2016.

Discussion ensued regarding representation on SANBAG.

Council Member Sandoval inquired whether there was a policy or ordinance that stated that certain individuals could serve on these boards and the time limit.

City Manager Hunt stated that related to outside committees, such as,

OMNITRANS or SANBAG, there was no policy regarding how long people could serve on them.

Council Member Sandoval stated that the Council should be rotating the representatives on SANBAG and IEUA (Inland Empire Utilities Agency), but that there were certain committees that the Mayor was the only one that could serve. Mr. Sandoval stated that Mayor Pro Tem Tahan was doing a great job and proposed a policy that the Council rotate representatives to serve a certain period of time. Mr. Sandoval added that Council Members did not have the responsibility to select the members on the Planning Commission or Parks Commission and should have the opportunity to appoint them.

Mayor Warren explained that the only other position that she held was on LAFCO (Local Agency Formation Commission) as an alternate, which was done by all the other mayors. Mayor Warren stated that she had no official standing as the Mayor for a committee other than Planning Commission and Parks Commission.

Discussion ensued regarding appointments to various committees and boards.

Council Member Sandoval stated that he would like to see a policy regarding rotating the positions on boards.

Mayor Warren stated that she was a team player and respectfully requested that she be selected as the representative on SANBAG, to move the city forward. Mayor Warren stated that she would continue to ask for a time limit and would consider July 2016 for a change.

B. Elected Officials Communications/Committee Reports

Council Member Salazar-Wibert thanked everyone that participated in the summer concerts, especially Hector, who was very helpful.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert gave a shout out to the Police Department for National Night Out; the event was packed and everyone had a great time and especially liked the tickets to children for good behavior.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert announced that the car show that was held on Friday, August 7, 2015 had been great.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert thanked the Fontana Chamber of Commerce for the invitation to attend the event in San Diego. A healthy conversation was held and she had been inspired by the comments but was not expecting the questions. The message had been loud and clear that more attention will be paid to how many 10,000 square foot lots were in the City.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert announced that a great car give-away was held at George's Shell Station and thanked Linda and Doug and Ms. Terri Schneider from the Boys and Girls Club of Fontana, who brought forward a grandmother who was raising her grandchildren..

Council Member Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the community meeting at the Heritage Community Center and thanked Southern California Edison and Lieutenant Obie Rodriquez for their assistance.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert acknowledged Ms. Fabiola Dominquez and Ms. Carmen Solang for their assistance at the Senior Center Celebration of Life that was held on August 7, 2015.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert wished Ms. Nancy Koehler a good night.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert announced that the community had lost Mr. Dennis Starkey and that a fund raiser was held to benefit the Starkey Family.

Council Member Salazar-Wibert asked that everyone continue to support our troops and their families.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan announced that he had attended the community meeting at the Heritage Center and the Police Department had done a great job.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan announced that mail boxes had been vandalized and what was being done about replacing them, and asked City Manager Hunt to bring back information regarding this issue.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan announced that he had attended the Chamber of Commerce event that was held on Thursday, August 6 and Friday, August 7, 2015, and that there had been a great discussion, and that the Chamber of Commerce was more proactive. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan thanked his long time and best friend Jeannette for being there.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan announced that he attended a FRST program meeting and that the program was great, had learned about the process and their resources. Mayor Pro Tem Tahan thanked Police Chief Jones and Captain Weissmann for their assistance.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan announced that school started on Thursday, August 6, 2015 and that the school year would be great, and added that he had missed Back-to-School Night.

Mayor Pro Tem Tahan asked that the City Council meeting adjourn in memory of Mr. Ted Alm.

There were no Elected Officials Communications received from Council Member Roberts.

Council Member Sandoval wished his son-in-law Mr. Willie Bolanos and his sister Ms. Betty Sandoval a happy birthday.

Council Member Sandoval thanked the Public Works and Police Departments for their assistance at the summer concerts.

Council Member Sandoval asked that the City Council meeting adjourn in memory of the following: 1) Mr. William Gonzales, active member in the City of Fontana, attended Resurrection Catholic Church, served in the Korean War, was a member of Legion Post 772, Teamster-Local 63, and at the age of 80 returned and obtained his high school diploma from Colton High School; 2) Mr. Henry Romo, a cousin to his wife (Council Member Sandoval sent his condolences); and 3) the City's K-9 pals (dogs) that should be recognized as fallen officers.

Mayor Warren announced that she had attended the Fontana Chamber of Commerce event and had heard their concerns loud and clear.

Mayor Warren announced that she had a lunch meeting with State Superintendent of Schools Tom Torlakson, Assembly Member Cheryl Brown, and San Bernardino County Supervisor Josie Gonzales to discuss how important education was to this community.

Mayor Warren announced that a Mayor's Educational Summit would be held and that 50 people would be invited. More details would be provided.

Mayor Warren announced that the Mayor's Gala would be held on Saturday, October 3, 2015 and all proceeds would benefit the Boys and Girls Club of Fontana. More details would be provided.

Mayor Warren announced that she had been invited to the premiere of the book on former Los Angeles Mayor Tom Bradley, which was held at Cal State University Los Angeles, and she was really proud to have been part of the first group on the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council in Los Angeles.

Mayor Warren announced that coalition building was a priority, and that everyone did not always have to agree but needed to work together. Mayor Warren proposed that after the vote in November 2015, that the City Council consider her as the SANBAG representative and requested their support.

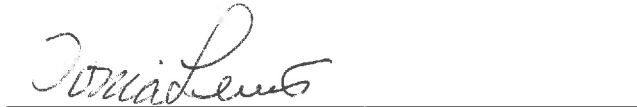
