WORKSHOP:

A. 5:00 P.M. WORKSHOP

A Workshop of the Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, March 22, 2016 in Fontana City Hall Executive Conference Room at 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. The workshop was called to order by Mayor Warren at 5:02 p.m. with Council Members Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval present; Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert arrived at 5:05 p.m.

(A) Interim Police Chief Bob Ramsey presented the Status of the Helicopter Program; and (B) Public Works Director Chuck Hays introduced Burrtec Waste, Inc., Vice President of Municipal Services Mike Arrequin. Mr. Arrequin presented an update on the proposed Trash Rate Increase. The Fontana City Council Regular Meeting Agenda was reviewed and City Manager Comments were heard.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATION:

By consensus of the City Council, public communications were reduced to two minutes per speaker.

Ms. Tressy Capps, Fontana resident, complained about the minutes not reflecting her full comments. She summarized her comments regarding the helicopter program and Greenhouse Gas Emissions and asked whether helicopters emit gas emissions. Ms. Capps added that she had liked the helicopter presentation Mayor Warren referred Ms. Capps to Community Development Director James Troyer for follow up.

The Regular Meeting of the Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, March 22, 2016
in the Grover W. Taylor Council Chambers, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California.
Mayor Warren called the meeting to order at 7:04 p.m.

ROLL CALL:

INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Following the Invocation by Westside Family Church Pastor Dawkins, the Pledge of
Allegiance was led by Council Member Sandoval.

CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT:

City Attorney Jeff Ballinger announced that there were no reportable action on the Closed
Session Items.

PROCLAMATIONS:

A. Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day

Mayor Warren and the City Council proclaimed March 30, 2016 as Welcome Home
Vietnam Veterans Day in the City of Fontana. Post 772 Commanders Jeane Rossiter
and Mike Rossiter, Post 626 Commander Marco Rodriguez, VFW 6563 Commander Jim
Arender, and Senior Center Veterans Club President Martin Daily, were present to accept
the proclamations in honor of Viet Nam Veterans.

B. Arbor Day

Mayor Warren and the City Council proclaimed April 7, 2016, as Arbor Day. Chuck Hays,

Public Works Director provided the history of Arbor Day. Mr. Hays announced Arbor Day to be held on April 7, 2016, 10:00 a.m., at the Mary Vagle Nature Center, 11501 Cypress Avenue in Fontana and invited everyone to attend the dedication.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

A. Retirement Recognition of Police Department Volunteers Ronald Rovere and Richard Anderson

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized Police Department Volunteers Ronald Rovere and Richard Anderson on their retirement from the Fontana Police Volunteer Program. Interim Police Chief Bob Ramsey provided a summary of their accomplishments and hard work. Certificates of Recognition were also presented by Assembly Member Cheryl Brown's Field Representative Lisa Blacksher and San Bernardino County Supervisor Janice Rutherford's office.

B. Special Recognition of Former Planning Commissioner Phil Cothran and Former Parks and Community Services Commissioner Lourdes Goni

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized former Planning Commissioner Phil Cothran and former Parks and Community Services Commissioner Lourdes Goni. Mr. Cothran was present to accept; Ms. Goni was unable to attend the meeting. A Certificate of Recognition was also presented by Assembly Member Cheryl Brown's Field Representative Lisa Blacksher.

C. Public Works Department - Employees of the Year Awards

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized and presented awards to Public Works Department employees of the year. Public Works Director Chuck Hays summarized the accomplishments for each employee as follows:

Certificates of Recognition were also presented by Assembly Member Cheryl Brown's Field Representative Lisa Blacksher and San Bernardino County Supervisor Janice Rutherford's office.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:

A. Public Communications

Ms. Bonnie Edmiston, Fontana Exchange Club, announced that the Grand Marshal of the 103rd Annual Fontana Day Festival and Parade would be City Manager Ken Hunt. Ms. Edmiston added that Mr. Hunt has been a City employee since 1990; a very humble man, with a strong commitment to the community.

Ms. Cathy Ritchey, Kiwanis Club of Fontana, announced a challenge for purchasing tickets for the Hen Derby.

Mr. Stephen Patereau, Senior Advisor for the Senior Center Veterans Club, spoke on connecting with the school district to educate students on the role that veterans have played in the nation's history. Mr. Patereau referred to a recent visit to Martin Luther King High School; they had been invited by the sophomore class and the students had asked them questions concerning their military experience.

Mr. Autry O'Day spoke on his concerns regarding the Fontana Police Department and complained about the negative treatment that his nephew received. Mr. O'Day's nephew was stopped for speeding along Sierra Avenue in Fontana.

Mr. Kenneth Bradshaw, Fontana resident, spoke on safety concerns regarding a U-Turn sign near the I-15 Freeway and Duncan Canyon Bridge in north Fontana. Mayor Warren referred Mr. Bradshaw to Engineering Director Ricardo Sandoval for follow up.

Mr. Danny Marquez, Veterans Partnering with Communities, thanked the Mayor and City Council for their continued support of the Veterans Resource Center and gave special thanks to Council Member Roberts for his donation that helped a veteran in the High Desert and to Council Member Tahan for his donations as well.. Mr. Marquez summarized the resources and services that are provided to veterans and their families.

Mr. Efren Paiz, Calvary Chapel-Summit Church, spoke on the many resources and services that are provided by the church. Mr. Paiz also announced Easter Sunday service to be held at Summit High School at 10:00 a.m. A fun zone, taco man and other fun activities would be offered and everyone was invited to attend.

Ms. Fran Givens, Fontana resident, spoke on the terrorist incident that had occurred in Brussels, Belgium and also spoke on Cuba and summarized a letter that was written by 12-year old Fidel Castro to President Roosevelt.

Ms. Deborah Hall Lindsey, Concerned Citizens for the Development of North Fontana, thanked the Mayor and the City Council for participating in the Black History Parade and provided Certificates of Recognition.

A. Quarterly Lien Action for Delinquent Sewer, Rubbish and Weed Abatement Accounts

Mayor Warren opened Public Hearing Item PH-A.

Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks provided the staff report.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

The Public Hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Tahan, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to approve Public Hearing Item "PH-A" (AYES: Warren, Salazar-Wibert, Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

1. Authorize staff to complete and record lien notices against real property for those

sewer accounts sixty days or more delinquent as described in the Certified Lien List and direct staff to forward recorded liens to the County for collection.

2. Authorize staff to complete and record liens against real property for those rubbish accounts more than ninety days delinquent as described in the Certified Lien List and direct staff to forward recorded liens to the County for collection.

3. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-020** of the City Council of the City of Fontana adopting the statement of unpaid expenses for weed abatement and imposing a lien against real property for payment thereof.

B. User Fees for City Services

Mayor Warren opened Public Hearing Item PH-B.

Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks provided the staff report.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

The Public Hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Roberts, seconded by Council Member Sandoval, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to approve Public Hearing Item "PH-B" (AYES: Warren, Salazar-Wibert, Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-021** adopting certain new fees and increasing, decreasing or deleting certain existing fees for various City services.

C. Public Hearing on Formation of Community Facilities District #81 (Gabriella)

Mayor Warren opened Public Hearing Item PH-C.

Management Services Director Lisa Strong provided the staff report.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

The Public Hearing was closed.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Roberts, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to approve Public Hearing Item "PH-C-1, C-2 and C-3" (AYES: Warren, Salazar-Wibert, Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

1. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-022** of the City Council of the City of Fontana of formation of the City of Fontana Community Facilities District No. 81 (Gabriella), authorizing the levy of a special tax within the community facilities district and establishing an appropriations limit for the community facilities district.

2. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-023** of the City Council of the City of Fontana deeming it

necessary to incur bonded indebtedness within the City of Fontana Community Facilities District No. 81 (Gabriella).

3. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-024** of the City Council of the City of Fontana calling special election for City of Fontana Community Facilities District No. 81 (Gabriella).

Mayor Warren asked that City Clerk Tonia Lewis open the ballot and announce the results of the election.

City Clerk Lewis announced that the results of the election were affirmative.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Sandoval, seconded by Council Member Tahan, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to approve Public Hearing Item "PH-C-4, C-5 and C-6" (AYES: Warren, Salazar-Wibert, Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

4. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-025** of the City Council of the City of Fontana declaring results of special election and directing the recording of notice of special tax lien.

5. Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1743** levying special taxes within the City of Fontana Community Facilities District No. 81 (Gabriella); and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.

6. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-026** of the City Council of the City of Fontana authorizing the execution and delivery of a Letter of Credit and Funding Agreement.

ELECTED OFFICIALS COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS:

A. Consideration of Change in Development Review Authority Amongst the Community Development Director, Planning Commission and City Council

City Manager Hunt stated about a few months ago a workshop had been held and the authority levels were to be reviewed in the Development Code for Council, Planning Commission and staff. One of the items that was discussed was the authority levels in the City code that was given to the Community Development Director. Mr. Hunt added that the Community Development Director has the ability to approve industrial projects under 100,000 square feet and commercial projects under 50,000 square feet. Discussion was held to possibly reduce those limits and Council directed staff to bring back a recommendation.

Mr. Hunt stated that an item on the agenda would basically cut those values in half, which is what staff thought they heard from the Council. He summarized that the proposed change would reduce industrial projects from under 100,000 square feet to under 50,000 square feet; and would reduce commercial projects from under 50,000 square feet to under 25,000 square feet and if the City Council concurred, then this item would be brought back to the City Council.

Council Member Tahan inquired about limits because a lot more infill projects would be coming forward and asked about the acreages for an industrial and commercial building,

and whether it would be a five acre or ten acre parcel.

Mr. Troyer stated that the acreages were five acres or less for an industrial project; and for two to four acres, you could have a retail project, but would depend on the site on Sierra or Foothill; one to four acres for infill, which would also depend upon the site.

Discussion ensued regarding acreages and square footage of buildings.

City Manager Hunt stated that typically for industrial projects you have a 50% coverage ratio. If you are talking about approval of 50,000 square feet, it would generally be about a 100,000 square foot land mass, and about 2.5 acres would be the limit for industrial. Mr. Hunt added that commercial projects would depend on the parking.

Council Member Tahan inquired about the report that was requested at the City Council Goal Setting Session regarding development projects.

Mr. Hunt stated that the staff was working on the report and was close to presenting the information.

Council Member Tahan asked whether a variance would need to be reviewed by the Planning Commission.

Mr. Troyer stated that some variances were reviewed by the Planning Commission that were under 25,000 square feet because they were bundled with other entitlement projects.

Mr. Hunt stated that staff can be directed to bring this item back to the City Council.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Sandoval, seconded by Council Member Tahan, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to approve staff recommendation (AYES: Warren, Salazar-Wibert, Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

That the City Council direct staff to process a Development Code Amendment lowering the development review authority of the Community Development Director from 49,999 square feet to 24,999 square feet for commercial projects and from 99,999 square feet to 49,999 square feet for industrial projects.

B. Elected Officials Communications/Committee Reports

Council Member Tahan sent his heartfelt thoughts to the people of Brussels, Belgium.

Council Member Tahan welcomed new Fire Chief Birchfield, and announced that he attended the grand opening of the new Fire Station at Banana Avenue and Foothill Boulevard.

Council Member Tahan announced that the City would continue to invest in public safety, which was a commitment from the City Council.

Council Member Tahan stated that it was a great week at the Speedway and there had been a lot of activities. He mentioned that Fox and ESPN had covered the event.

Council Member Tahan announced that there had been a Goodwill Store grand opening on Thursday and was concerned that there had not been enough announcements. Mr. Tahan stated that announcements of events needed to go on the City website's front page along with other meetings and would like to have it adjusted for better exposure of events.

Council Member Sandoval requested that an Ad Hoc Committee meeting with the school district be set up, to discuss honoring our Vietnam veterans, and also to reach out to Etiwanda and Colton School Districts to discuss honoring our Vietnam veterans.

City Manager Hunt requested clarification regarding an Ad Hoc Committee meeting and whether the meeting was to be with the Fontana Unified School District.

Council Member Sandoval stated that was correct, and to include Colton and Etiwanda School Districts.

Council Member Sandoval announced that the First International Women's Event was held on March 8, 2016.

Council Member Sandoval announced that he attended the open house for the new Fire Station.

Council Member Sandoval congratulated Police Department Volunteers Ron and Richard for volunteering for the City.

Council Member Sandoval announced that photos of the City's Mayors were in the lobby and former Mayor Scialdone's photo was not on the wall in the lobby. Mr. Sandoval requested that former Mayor Scialdone's photo be added as Mayor.

City Manager Hunt stated that the Mayor's photos are put up for the elected mayors and not the appointed mayors. He requested direction and action of the City Council.

Mayor Warren asked that the City Manager be directed to look into it.

Discussion ensued to bring the item back.

Mr. Hunt stated that the photos of Council Members were also in the lobby.

Council Member Sandoval announced that his daughter Theresa and grandson Sebastian would be arriving in about a month and wished his daughter Cecelia a happy birthday.

Council Member Roberts thanked the staff for the work that was done on the new Fire Station.

Council Member Roberts congratulated new Fire Chief Jeff Birchfield.

Council Member Roberts thanked his friend Phil Cothran for all his work on the Planning Commission.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert thanked the coaches, players, parents and everyone for all that they did for the Little League Opening Ceremonies.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that MOD Pizza is now open and located on Sierra Lakes Parkway in Fontana.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert congratulated new Fire Chief Jeff Birchfield.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert congratulated everyone on the opening of the new Fire Station.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert congratulated Mr. Bob Green and Mr. Dennis Cunningham for having the Fire Station named after them.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended Casino Night at the Senior Center.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the Veterans Health Fair and thanked Danny Marquez and volunteers of Veterans Partnering with Communities for all their hard work. It was well done.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the women's event at the Women's Club and great women had been recognized.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced the Walkathon to benefit the Ronald McDonald House to be held on Sunday, April 3, 2016, 8:00 a.m., Citizens Bank Arena. The walk would be 3.5 miles.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that Post 772 would have their own Walk for Kids to be held on April 9, 2016 at 16767 Spring Street in Fontana. All proceeds to benefit the Ronald McDonald House.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that FLIP (Fontana Leadership Intervention Program) would be hosting a car show to be held on April 30, 2016, 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., at 9680 Citrus Avenue in Fontana. Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert congratulated Jeremy on the arrival of his baby boy and to Krista and Kevin on their new baby boy.

B. City Manager Communications




ADJOURNMENT:
