

**MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WORKSHOP:

A. 5:30 P.M. WORKSHOP

A Workshop of the Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, April 12, 2016 in the Fontana City Hall Executive Conference Room, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana. The workshop was called to order by Mayor Warren at 5:30 p.m. with Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert and Council Members Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval present.

Director of Public Works Chuck Hays introduced Fontana Water Company representatives as follows: Chief Executive Officer Mike Whitehead, President Robert Nicholson, Senior Vice President Robert DiPrimio, Vice President Joel Reiker, and General Manager Josh Swift. A Fontana Water Company Workshop was held to discuss a recycled water partnership that benefited both city taxpayers and school district budgets. The Fontana City Council Regular Agenda was reviewed and City Manager Comments were heard.

There were no public communications received.

A. 7:00 P.M. Call the Meeting to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, April 12, 2016 in the Grover W. Taylor Council Chambers at 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. Mayor Warren called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

ROLL CALL:

Present: Mayor Warren, Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert, and Council Members Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval.

Absent: None.

INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Following the Invocation by Mr. Corey Brian, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Council Member Tahan.

CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT:

City Attorney Jeff Ballinger reported that there were no reportable action on the Closed Session items.

PROCLAMATIONS:

A. Donate Life Month

Mayor Warren and the City Council proclaimed the Month of April as Donate Life Month. Donate Life Run/Walk Ambassador Allen Jolley summarized the importance of organ donations, encouraged everyone to be an organ donor, and accepted the proclamation on behalf of Donate Life Run/Walk Ambassadors Susan Van Campen and John Van Campen, who not were not present to accept.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:

A. Retirement Recognition for Fontana Fire Chief Jon McLinn

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized Fontana Fire Chief Jon McLinn on his retirement, and thanked him for all his hard work in Fontana. Former Fire Chief McLinn stated that he had attended Fontana High School and had always loved the community of Fontana; he had applied team work skills that he had learned in football to managing his department.

B. Special Recognition of Fontana Student Kimberly Salazar

Mayor Warren and the City Council recognized Fontana Student Kimberly Salazar on receiving a perfect score on the Advanced Placement Spanish Language and Culture Exam. Mayor Warren stated that Ms. Salazar not only received the top score of 5 on the

exam but was one of 55 students in the world to earn every point possible on the exam. In addition, there were 37 different AP exams given to millions of high school students around the world, and her score was one of only 322 perfect scores last year on the AP test. Ms. Salazar stated that her words of wisdom to students was to have confidence, and trust themselves about what they had learned throughout the year.

PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:

A. Public Communications

Mayor Warren announced that the Public Communications would be five minutes per speaker.

Ms. Cathy Ritchey reminded everyone that ticket sales for the Hen Derby would end on April 30, 2016. For ticket information, the contact number provided was (909) 559-2024 or to visit the Sizzler Restaurant on Tuesdays between 12:00 p.m. and 12:30 p.m. Ms. Ritchey stated that all the money raised after the pay out would benefit the students in Fontana for scholarships.

Mr. Lester W. Hesse, Jr., homeless man, spoke on curfews for minors, unauthorized bicycling and wearing a helmet, skateboarding, and littering signs.

Mr. Andres Ramirez, Omnitrans representative, spoke on the West Valley Connector Bus Rapid Transit Project, that would be on Foothill Boulevard and then south on Sierra Avenue to Valley Boulevard. He announced that Omnitrans had started the preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Report to study a 25-mile long bus rapid transit project that proposed limited stops, providing speed and quality improvements to the public transit system within the corridor. Mr. Ramirez announced a public scoping meeting to be held on Tuesday, April 19, 2016, 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., Fontana Woman's Club, at 16880 Seville Avenue in Fontana.

Ms. Lori Perales, Calvary Chapel-Summit Church at 7970 Cherry Avenue (next door to Winco) spoke on the many services and resources that the church provided. Ms. Perales announced upcoming events, such as, weekly bible studies to begin in September, a Men's Breakfast for \$10.00/person, and a Women's Retreat in May. Mr. Larry Meyer, representing Rancho Cucamonga Sacred Heart Parish Father Ben (noted that the congregation was mostly from Fontana), spoke on the Eagle Project Dedication Ceremony, in memory of the 14 victims of the December 2, 2015 shooting in San Bernardino, to be held on Sunday, April 17, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.

Mr. Dennis W. Alcorn spoke on the Kaiser Museum and how it would benefit Fontana by educating the residents about Kaiser Steel and that it was important for heritage. Mr. Alcorn stated that funding was needed for the Fontana Kaiser Museum. Mayor Warren stated that the City was seeking funding and continues to work with the Fontana Historical Society.

Ms. Karen Ayers, Fontana Chamber of Commerce Executive Director, spoke on a free business seminar sponsored by Assemblymember Cheryl Brown, in partnership with the Fontana Chamber of Commerce and Facebook, to be held on Friday, April 22, 2016, from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., Cypress Neighborhood Center, 8380 Cypress Avenue in Fontana. Mr. Danny Marquez, Veterans Partnering with Communities, spoke on the many services and programs that were offered at the Veterans Resource Center. Mr. Marquez announced the CAP Resource Fair to be held on Thursday, April 21, 2016, 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Jessie Turner Center in Fontana; and a Veterans Resource Fair hosted by Congresswoman Norma Torres to be held on Saturday, April 23, 2016, 9:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m., at the Montclair Community Center in Montclair. For more information, to contact Mr. Michael Cervantes at (909) 481-6474. Mr. Marquez also announced a Family Fun Appreciation Day to be held on June 25, 2016 at Martin Tudor Park, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; physical activities and games to be offered. For more information, the contact number provided was (909) 355-3036.

Ms. Angelena Jones spoke on mailbox break-ins and that the post office came out to repair them and said that it was not their responsibility. She added that the residents purchased a 16 cluster mailbox and now had a better mailbox. A brief discussion ensued regarding whether the post office or the City was responsible for replacing mailboxes. Mayor Warren stated that the City was not responsible for the mailboxes and referred Ms. Jones to Community Development Director James Troyer for follow up.

Ms. Fran Givens, Fontana resident, spoke on a collection that was held for the Ronald McDonald House. She congratulated the City for proclaiming the month of April Donate Life Month and added that she had met four month old Benjamin at the Ronald McDonald House and he was going to have a heart transplant.

Ms. Givens announced that next month was Senior Month and would have an update on the senior legislative act.

Mr. Sol Guerra, representing Congresswoman Norma Torres, spoke on the following upcoming events: a Youth Advisory Committee six-month program to be launched in June for sophomores and seniors; and, a Veterans Resource Fair to be on April 23, 2016 and case workers would be available to assist veterans work through the "red tape".

Ms. Kathy Ponce, Fontana resident, spoke about the Omnitrans meeting to be held at the Woman's Club and encouraged everyone to attend. Ms. Ponce announced that it was campaign season and that Fontana had four people who really cared about Fontana. Ms. Ponce added that there was a grassroots group of 25 people who were talking to residents about Councilmember Sandoval and his efforts for the city. She stated that the city did not need a consensus driven council; she encouraged everyone to get to know Councilmember Sandoval and Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert.

CONSENT CALENDAR:

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Public Hearing on Annexation of Territory to Community Facilities District No. 56M; Located north of Arrow between Laurel and Locust. Calling for a Special Election of the Voters of Community Facilities District No. 56M; and Adoption of Resolution Declaring the Results of the Special Election

Mayor Warren opened Public Hearing Item PH-A.

Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks and Senior Accountant Jeff Moriarty provided the staff report.

Council Member Tahan asked about whether the City could legally incorporate maintenance costs for mailboxes.

City Manager Hunt stated that mailboxes were under the ownership of the property owner and that it would become illegal to spend public funds on mail boxes. He added that there would have to be a process to change the ownership from private to public ownership, and that there could also be an issue of liability. Mr. Hunt concluded that to make the district or the city be responsible becomes a policy issue for the City Council.

A brief discussion ensued regarding allocating monies for this purpose.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert stated that she had received many calls about mailbox break-ins. Mrs. Wibert asked if mailboxes were owned by the property owner, and what happened if there were renters. City Manager Hunt stated that the property owner was still responsible.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert stated that each mailbox was about \$60.00 and asked whether a property owner could place a mailbox in front of their home instead of having a cluster of mailboxes.

Mayor Warren stated that this was a good subject to look into but did not think the process should be burdened with this issue. Mayor Warren stated that this was an issue for the post office and applauded the property owner's efforts to correct the issue.

Council Member Tahan stated that this issue could be brought back to the Council.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

The Public Hearing was closed.

Mayor Warren requested that City Clerk Lewis open the ballot and announce the results of the election. City Clerk Lewis announced that the election results were affirmative.

ACTION: Motion was made by Council Member Tahan, seconded by Council Member Roberts, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to adopt Public Hearing Item "PH-A" (AYES: Warren, Salazar-Wibert, Roberts, Tahan and Sandoval; NOES: None) as follows:

1. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-027** of the City Council of the City of Fontana Calling a Special Election and submitting to the qualified electors of territory proposed to be annexed to Community Facilities District No. 56M of the City of Fontana the question of Levying Special Taxes within the territory proposed to be annexed. (Annexation No. 4).

2. Adopt **Resolution No. 2016-028** of the City Council of the City of Fontana declaring the results of the Special Election for Annexation No. 4 to Community Facilities District No. 56M of the City of Fontana on the proposition of the annual levy of Special Taxes within the territory proposed to be annexed to said Community Facilities District to the costs of certain services to be provided by the Community Facilities District, determining that the territory proposed to be annexed is added to and part of said Community Facilities District with full legal effect, and ordering the recording of an Amendment to the Notice of Special Tax Lien for said Community Facilities including the territory annexed thereto (Annexation No. 4).

ELECTED OFFICIALS COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS:

A. Discussion and Possible Action Regarding the Westgate Specific Plan Ad Hoc Sub Committee Recommendation – (Tahan and Sandoval)

Mayor Warren announced that the Westgate Specific Plan Ad Hoc Subcommittee recommendation and a possible action would be discussed.

Council Member Tahan stated that the project had been challenging and thanked all the members of the Ad Hoc Subcommittee and the developer for their patience and working with everyone.

Mayor Warren stated that staff would provide a staff report, public communication would be heard, and then the item would be brought back to the Council for discussion.

Community Development Director James Troyer and Associate Planner DiTanyon Johnson provided the staff report.

Mayor Warren announced that public communications would be provided and that there would be five minutes per speaker.

Mr. Michael Zetlmaier, Fontana resident, spoke on Westgate and stated that west of San Sevaine he would like to see residential—7,200 minimum lot sizes—and that roads were needed.

Mr. Michael McCloud, Fontana resident, spoke about his concerns regarding the Westgate Specific Plan and said at the first meeting the developer was told what was wanted and the developer had done very minor changes. He added that the City was

supposed to be better than neighboring Rancho Cucamonga and to stop trying to reinvent the wheel. Mr. McCloud stated that the Westgate developer had not been honest with them and had talked about land that was not owned by the developer. He added that maybe he needed to get into politics to stop the nonsense, and that he supported Council Member Sandoval and Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert and was sure that the Council had three brave people to stop the project.

Mr. Fil Mota, Fontana resident for 23 years, spoke on the Westgate Specific Plan and stated that he was very concerned about what was going on and felt he lived in a safe community and would like to keep it that way. He added that the police and fire have done a great job and the Council needed to listen to residents' voices.

Mr. Bruno Mancinelli, Fontana landowner and Victorville resident, stated that he owned 10 acres on Victoria near the freeway. He expressed his concerns about changing the zoning, and that there was a 200-foot buffer from the freeway that abutted his property. He stated that by placing housing, 200 feet would be taken and thereby reduce his property to half, which would place a tremendous hardship on him. Mr. Mancinelli added that he did not want homes built near the freeway and would like to have his parcel pulled out of Westgate, and allow him to work with staff to decide the future of his property.

Mayor Warren stated that the Council was assessing the Ad Hoc Committee's recommendation. If accepted, the item would then go to a public hearing on May 10, 2016 and at that time requests from Westgate, property owners and the Ad Hoc Committee would be considered.

Mr. Dino DeFazio, Fontana landowner and Apple Valley resident, spoke on his concerns regarding the Westgate Specific Plan and stated that the current zoning was MU (Mixed Uses) and requested that the MU zoning be retained. Mr. DeFazio outlined the location of the parcel relative to the freeway.

Ms. Kathy Ponce, Westgate Specific Plan Ad Hoc Committee Member, thanked Council Member Tahan for creating the Ad Hoc Committee, which brought the community together and created an open dialogue in the community. She added that some issues were not put forth honestly. Ms. Ponce stated that 10,000 square foot homes were wanted, which would be lost with this development. She added that there were a lot of changes and good advancements in the plan but was concerned about the homes, and did not want condos, townhomes, or apartments.

Mayor Warren stated that because of the Brown Act all members of the Council could not initially attend the Ad Hoc Committee meetings, but later that changed. Mayor Warren explained that it was the Ad Hoc Committee's responsibility to meet with the residents and developer, and the Ad Hoc Committee's representatives would inform the Council about what happened.

Council Member Tahan thanked everyone for being patient and emotions can get high in tough situations but felt that a lot was accomplished. Mr. Tahan stated that Mr. McCloud had his own ideas, which were respected. Mr. Tahan added that when the Ad Hoc Committee started to look at three areas: North, Center and South, everyone was okay

with the North area, as well as Mr. McCloud. He added that when zoning is looked at throughout the City it was the City Council that changes the zoning, and a property owner could go through the process for a zone change. Mr. Tahan stated that the Center area was a different situation and would like to have the Center area be a destination point, such as, for entertainment, corporate, medical, and educational uses.

Council Member Sandoval stated that until the property owner came in that they did not know that their land was going to be changed from 10,000 square foot lots. Mr. Sandoval stated that it was hard for him to support this, and work was still needed on this and wanted to make sure that we got this right.

Council Member Tahan stated that the R-4 and R-5 were taken out completely and the City had to go back and recertify the housing element.

City Attorney Ballinger stated that the City needed to locate high density property for a R-4 zone.

Council Member Tahan stated that at this time nothing was being changed.

City Attorney Ballinger stated that was correct.

Discussion ensued regarding the housing element, and City Attorney Ballinger explained the next steps for the City Council's action.

Mayor Warren stated that there were three issues: 1) the Ad Hoc Committee had ended; 2) that the item was not being approved at the Council meeting and there was still time for input; 3) and that staff be given direction to set up a public hearing to deal with the appeal from the developer and to consider a property owner request to be removed from the Westgate Specific Plan.

Mayor Warren stated that the City approved the housing element, which was sent to the state. She added that affordable housing had to be identified for people who lived or worked here and could afford the home or the land. Mayor Warren stated that the Council could not simply say 1500 units would be removed, because every plan and project would stop and that the housing element had been violated. Mayor Warren stated that clarification was needed on whether 1500 units could be removed.

Discussion ensued regarding a motion to move forward with a public hearing on May 10, 2016 and to work out the issues and give staff time to work with the property owners and people in the community.

Council Member Tahan stated that the Ad Hoc Committee did not support R-4 and R-5 in the Center area and that he would not support R-4 or R-5. Mr. Tahan stated he did not feel that the City was out of compliance yet but needed staff to start working on it.

Discussion ensued regarding directing staff to provide options.

Council Member Roberts stated that he felt that the best and highest use had not been established for the Westgate Specific Plan and did not feel that the property owner had

seen the highest and best use yet and did not want to rush the process. Mr. Roberts added that it may be premature to dissolve the Ad Hoc Committee, and wanted to permit Council Members Tahan and Sandoval to continue their work on this.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert asked whether the Council Members and other committee members were available to be on the committee. Mrs. Wibert stated that this was the last land in this community and that it should not be wasted.

Mayor Warren stated that the Ad Hoc Committee had done a really good job but there were issues to be resolved, such as, one area that still needed to be decided on, one landowner would like to be removed from Westgate and the housing element. Mayor Warren stated that if the public hearing was held on May 10, that the same issues may still need to be discussed, but that they needed to make sure that the public hearing was set.

Council Member Sandoval stated that the Ad Hoc Committee should continue to permit people's comments to come forward. Mr. Sandoval added that may be a few more meetings to address the issues that they were not aware of, and to make sure that the issues were addressed.

Council Member Tahan stated that he agreed with Mayor Warren that setting a time frame for the Ad Hoc Committee was necessary, but did not believe that everyone was going to agree on everything and everyone had a different perspective. Mr. Tahan stated that everyone needed to find a way to work together and move forward.

Mayor Warren inquired whether a public hearing could be set but a workshop be held before the public hearing to hear from the public.

City Attorney Ballinger responded yes.

Mayor Warren stated that a workshop was needed to look at the plan and to hear from the community.

Council Member Roberts stated that the subcommittee had recommended some significant changes, especially the R-5 issue and would like to see it resolved, and relocate the R-5 for the housing element. Mr. Roberts added that he would like to tie up the loose ends before going to a public hearing.

Mayor Warren suggested that the item be tabled for now and have staff come back to let Council know about the housing element.

City Manager Hunt asked in what form did the Council want the item to come back.

Mayor Warren stated that a workshop be held on a separate evening.

Discussion ensued concerning the R-5 issue and a workshop to be held.

Council Member Roberts asked whether there was a concern about having the Ad Hoc Committee run concurrently with the workshop because he did not want to lose continuity.

City Attorney Ballinger stated that it was the desire of the City Council to direct it.

Mayor Warren stated that she would like to have a workshop and work with staff on the housing element and not eliminate the subcommittee during this meeting. As stated by the Mayor, it was the consensus of the City Council.

B. Elected Officials Communications/Committee Reports

City Clerk Lewis thanked Council Member Sandoval for coming to the Historical Society to help replace the memorial plaques in the Rose Garden, which was very much appreciated.

City Treasurer Koehler-Brooks reminded everyone that the new booklets regarding all the events going on in the City were available.

City Treasurer Koehler-Brooks announced that she had attended the Above the Limits program for the developmentally disabled at the Heritage Center and that the magic show had been fabulous.

Council Member Roberts congratulated former Fire Chief Jon McLinn on his retirement and that he had done a great job with the City and County, and the 33 years that he worked with him as well.

Council Member Roberts stated that Fontana is one of the safest communities, in not only police personnel but from a fire perspective as well. Mr. Roberts stated that this was the 30th year that the City established its fire sprinkler ordinance in 1986. He added that the City had a Class II rating and that he had asked the fire staff to look into getting Fontana a Class I rating.

Council Member Roberts announced that he had attended the City/County Conference that was held from March 31st through April 1, 2016 in Lake Arrowhead, California.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that there had been a lot of volunteering throughout the City.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the Explorer/Volunteer Dinner and thanked the volunteers for the many hours that were devoted to volunteering.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the State of the County and had a great time and thanked the San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors for a great event.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended Arbor Day that was held at the Mary Vagle Center and encouraged everyone to visit the center. She thanked Community Services Department and staff, Rick and Garth, and Public Works Department and Chuck and staff, for a job well done.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the Senior Prom and congratulated the new King and Queen and Prince and Princess. She added that the event had a live band, Bump Town, who was one of Fontana's favorites.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the mural painting at Fontana High School and everyone came out to lend a hand and thanked the United Way.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert announced that she had attended the Ronald McDonald Walk for Kids at Ontario Citizens Bank Arena and thousands were in attendance, and thanked all the volunteers.

Mayor Pro Tem Salazar-Wibert gave a shout out to Lana, daughter of Edward, Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, who sang the National Anthem.
