**PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

**A. Public Hearing to Establish Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Assessment Rates for Landscape Maintenance Districts and Local Lighting Maintenance District**

Mayor Warren opened Public Hearing Item PH-A.

Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks and Senior Accountant Jeff Moriarty provided the staff report.

Ms. Kathy Ponce, Fontana resident, spoke on the Village of Heritage maintenance issues and stated that she had reviewed the maintenance contract and budget and had concerns. She wanted to see that the money is being spent in the Village of Heritage.

City Manager Hunt referred Ms. Ponce to Public Works Manager Keith Kramer for follow up.

Mr. Hunt stated that the City bids out these services and the bid was typically done by square footage. The Village of Heritage is larger than Hunter's Ridge and much of the current challenge was created by the drought. Per the Governor's direction, any sort of grass median landscaping cannot be watered, and to change the turf to drought tolerant, had not received support.

Council Member Sandoval asked how close was the City to using reclaimed water, because that would save the vegetation and turf, and had the City worked with the water district.

City Manager Hunt stated that staff has reached out to the Cucamonga Valley Water District regarding reclaimed water in the Village of Heritage, but that the Water District needed to work with the Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA).

Council Member Sandoval asked whether staff had communicated with the IEUA representative.

Mayor Warren responded yes.

Ms. Jasmin Hall, Inland Empire Utilities Agency (IEUA) Representative, stated that the IEUA had submitted a funding request for the Village of Heritage and were waiting on a response. She added that the IEUA had worked with the Cucamonga Valley Water District, and when the IEUA received funding approval that the IEUA would partner with the members that were part of the IEUA.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

The Public Hearing was closed.

Mayor Warren opened Public Hearing Item PH-B.

Planning Manager Zai AbuBakar and Engineering Supervisor Kathy Raasch provided the staff report.

Mr. James Constant, landowner, spoke in opposition to the project, and disputed that Sierra Lakes Parkway was based on a final order of condemnation. He referred to a Caltrans document dated January 2015, which included Attachment A that he considered fraudulent. Mr. Constant added that Caltrans is supposed to pay for property and he had not received any payment for the property.

Mr. Robert Constant, spoke in opposition, and stated that prior to the Planning Commission meeting he had submitted 21 concerns, and that the Planning



Commission had not had the time to study what he had submitted. Mr. Constant added that the City's answers were not responsive, and that the Planning Commission focuses on approving specific projects and this project had larger city-wide impacts. He asked what was the highest and best use for any area, and that sufficient warehouses were in the City, and there might be better uses.

Mr. Nikos Constant, attorney for Constant Family Trust, stated that he reserved the rights that they have under litigation. Mr. Constant stated that this was an environmental impact that had changed the Inland Empire, and there was going to be an impact on future generations because they were being poisoned. He added that it was time to litigate this.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.

The Public Hearing was closed.

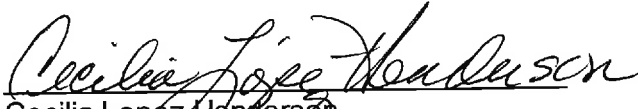
