

**MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF FONTANA  
REGULAR MEETING  
SEPTEMBER 22, 2010**

**WORKSHOP**

A workshop meeting of the Fontana City Council was held on Wednesday, September 22, 2010, in the City of Fontana Executive Conference Room, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. Mayor Scialdone called the workshop to order at 5 p.m.

**ROLL CALL:**

Present: Mayor Scialdone, Mayor Pro Tem Warren (arrived at 5:49 p.m.), and Council Members Roberts and Rutherford.

Absent: None.

Fontana Police Department Captain Bob Ramsey, Animal Services Officer Jamie Simmons, and Police Lieutenant Gary Aulis discussed animal services in the City, animal population curtailments of nearby agencies, and the effects of animal populations on City residents.

The Fontana City Council Regular Meeting Agenda was reviewed.

City Manager Comments were heard.

The workshop meeting adjourned at 6 p.m.

**REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING**

The Regular Meeting of the City of Fontana City Council was held on Wednesday, September 22, 2010, in the City of Fontana Council Chambers, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. Mayor Scialdone called the meetings to order at 7:04 p.m.

**ROLL CALL:**

Present: Mayor Scialdone, Mayor Pro Tem Warren, and Council Members Roberts and Rutherford.

Absent: None.

**CLOSED SESSION:** None.

Following the Invocation by Council Member Roberts, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Pro Tem Warren.

**SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT**

A special announcement was made by Mayor Scialdone that Fontana has been named One of the 100 Best Communities for Young People, joining local cities such as Burbank, Chino, and Irvine in the honor of successfully collaborating with all sectors of the community in providing education, recreation, faith-based programs, and other promising services to develop local youths. As this is the second honor (the first occurring in 2008), Mayor Scialdone highlighted the community's continued commitment and thanked the Fontana Unified School District, Board of Education, and local businesses.

Mayor Pro Tem Warren expressed her gratefulness for Fontana's honor and thanked Fontana residents for their support.

Council Member Rutherford expressed thanks to local schools for their support of the community and its youth.

Council Member Roberts reminded residents of last Council Meeting's honor of local athletes and this night's continuation of recognition of great youths and the City's great facilities.

**PROCLAMATIONS**

- A) Mayor Scialdone Proclaimed September 25, 2010, as National Day of Remembrance in honor and remembrance of murder victims and their families. Parents of Murdered Children (POMC) Inland Empire Chapter Leader Agnes Gibboney was present to accept the Proclamation.

Ms. Gibboney announced the Memorial Monument Unveiling to occur at 10 a.m. this Saturday, September 25, 2010, at the Green Acres to mark the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Commemorative of National Day of Remembrance. 200 guests are expected.

- B) Mayor Scialdone Proclaimed the week of October 3-9, 2010, as Fire Prevention Week. Fire Chief John Salvate and Fire Prevention Supervisor and Marshall Adams Panos were present to accept the Proclamation.

Fire Chief Salvate invited City residents to visit their local Fire Station during Fire Prevention Week, to the Open House Oct. 16<sup>th</sup> 10-2 p.m. at Fire Station No. 71 at Sierra and Arrow Avenues. Fire Chief Salvate also reminded residents of the upcoming time change and to update their smoke detectors and batteries.

Adam Panos announced the origination of Fire Prevention Week in 1925, the overall focus on fire safety, local information on display at the Lewis Library and in City Hall, and the Smoke Alarms theme.

- A) Mayor Scialdone introduced Police Chief Rod Jones who recognized Detectives Shawn Hare and Daniel Delgado-Oramas as the August 2010 Employees of the Month.
- B) Mayor Scialdone introduced President Tom Rivera and presented Certificates of Recognition on the behalf of the Mayor and Council to the Twisted Sisters Fontana Girls Senior Softball Team players, coaches, manager in recognition for winning District and the Amateur Softball Association of America (ASA) 2010 State Champions held in Lancaster, CA. The team also placed 6th in Nationals held in Yakima, WA.

Mayor Scialdone thanked the Twisted Sisters Softball Team players, coaches, and supporters, stressed the importance of volunteerism, and expressed pride in the great sportsmanship and leadership of this City.

**PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:**

The following Public Communications were received:

Doyle Tolbert spoke regarding Veteran's Post 262, local fundraising efforts throughout Southern California to support Veteran services, and the need for remote caller bingo in the City.

Mayor Scialdone announced that a City Council Meeting workshop on remote caller bingo was held in the last few months and this City currently does not currently allow the remote caller bingo.

Tressy Capps spoke regarding the importance of voting and participation in the upcoming November Election, her campaign for a City Council seat, and encouraged residents to contact her at (951) 333-2000.

Anne Knickerbocker spoke regarding the Eddie the Eagle Proclamation listed on this evening's agenda and her opposition of the National Rifles Association. Ms. Knickerbocker also spoke regarding alternatives to youth violence.

Pastor Emory B. James thanked the City for their cards and concerns during his recovery from surgery, with special thanks to Council Member Roberts, Police Chief Jones, Janet Koehler-Brooks, and Former Mayor Mark Nuaimi. Pastor James also encouraged Fontana Election Candidates to run fair election campaigns and invited residents and candidates to attend the 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Epheisans New Testament Church to be held on Saturday, September 25, 2010, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., at 16380 Merrill Avenue and to include a parking lot festival with free music, games, and prizes.

Eric Bishop, Dean of Chaffey College, thanked the Mayor and City Council for attendance and support at recent events and for their leadership and partnership in support of higher education in the community.

Stephen Rogers spoke regarding the September 23, 2010, San Bernardino County Planning Commission Meeting, an item regarding the consideration of noise levels related to the proposed Auto Club Speedway drag strip, and urged residents to oppose the proposal and call (909) 559-9622 for more information.

Mike Espinoza spoke regarding the upcoming November Election, the campaigns of local candidates, and the City's finances.

Mayor Scialdone clarified that the debt Mr. Espinoza spoke about was with the Redevelopment Agency rather than the City, spoke regarding the City and Redevelopment Agency's financial success, and reminded residents of the \$33 million in redevelopment funds that were taken by the State.

Fran Givens spoke regarding the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act and encouraged residents to report local false advertised prices and handicap concerns. Ms. Givens also presented a Fontana School District 1953/1954 Civil Defense Booklet to City Clerk Tonia Lewis on behalf of the Historical Society.

Carlos Bravo spoke regarding the August 27, 2010, Adjourned Regular City Council Meeting, the funding of the Duncan Canyon Overpass, and the need for transparency of City Council Meetings.

Mark Nuaimi congratulated the City of Fontana, Fontana Unified School District, and the community for Fontana's second naming as one of the nation's 100 Best Communities for Young People. Mr. Nuaimi read an America's Promise Alliance article which described Fontana's Parks as world-class facilities and commented on the recent results of sales tax revenue for Fontana which is the highest in the area. Mr. Nuaimi also spoke regarding his attendance at the August 27, 2010, Adjourned Regular City Council Meeting and the City's funding of projects that create economic development and facility improvements.

Eliz Lopez spoke regarding the September 23, 2010, San Bernardino County Planning Commission Meeting, an item regarding consideration of noise levels related to the proposed Auto Club Speedway drag strip, and urged residents to oppose the proposal and consider the fuel and pollutant effects.

Mayor Scialdone commented that a quorum of the Mayor and City Council attended the League of California Cities Annual Conference held at the San Diego Convention Center from September 15-17, 2010, and that the conference related to State business, rather than local City business.

San Bernardino County Second District Supervisor Paul Biane spoke regarding the joint and successful assistance of the San Bernardino County, the City of Fontana, and representative Scott Van Horne in resolving the flooding at a local County residential area located on Banana and Rose Avenues. Supervisor Biane also commented on the establishment of a joint County and City fund to support the potential Almond Annexation Area.

Mayor Scialdone thanked the City and County Board of Supervisors for their support in correcting the residential flooding issue and the establishment and use of a partnership fund to continue to support local concerns.

Gene Born thanked the City and County, along with Annexation Program Coordinator Cecilia Henderson for correcting the flooding issue at his residence. Mr. Born also thanked the City for the new Cypress Overpass which reduced his travel time.

Mayor Scialdone expressed thanks to Mr. Born and also apologized for misplacing the public comment card.

Accept replacement of securities for Tract No. 16873 necessitated by change in ownership of the tract and authorize the City Manager to enter into a subdivision agreement with KB Home for the construction of improvements in said tract.
- E) Approve the Measure I Five Year Capital Project Needs Analysis and the Five Year Local Street Program  
Adopt **Resolution 2010-098** of the City Council of the City of Fontana, adopting the Measure I Five Year Capital Project Needs Analysis (CPNA) and the Measure I Five Year Local Street Program.
- F) School Crossing Guard Contract Amendment  
Approve contract amendment and extension with Fontana Unified School District and Etiwanda School District for crossing guard services provided by All City

Management Services, with a revision to the Fiscal Impact Section to correct City costs from \$85,620 to \$84,919.30.

- G) Reinstatement of Alarm Business Permit Fee  
Adopt **Resolution No. 2010-099** of the City Council of the City of Fontana approving Alarm Company permit reinstatement fees after suspension.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Council Member Rutherford, seconded by Council Member Roberts, and carried unanimously by vote of 4-0, to approve Consent Calendar Items "A-G," with the correction made to the Fiscal Impact in Item F regarding the City cost for the School Crossing Guard Contract.

**PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

- A) Hearing was opened to consider Quarterly Lien Action for Delinquent Sewer, Rubbish and Weed Abatement Accounts.

No written communication was received.

Staff presentation was given by Management Services Accounting Manager Dawn Brooks.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

The hearing was closed.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Council Member Roberts, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Warren, and carried unanimously by vote of 4-0, to:

- (1) Authorize staff to complete and record lien notices against real property for those sewer accounts sixty days or more delinquent as described in the Certified Lien List and direct staff to forward recorded liens to the County for collection.
- (2) Authorize staff to complete and record liens against real property for those rubbish accounts more than ninety days delinquent as described in the certified Lien List and direct staff to forward recorded liens to the County for collection.
- (3) Adopt **Resolution No. 2010-100** of the City Council of the City of Fontana adopting the statement of unpaid expenses for weed abatement and imposing a lien against real property for payment thereof.

- B) Hearing was opened to consider a Resolution of Necessity for the Citrus Avenue Interchange.

One written communication was received from Duff Murphy of the Law Offices of Oliver, Sandifer, and Murphey.

No other written communications were received.

Staff presentation was given by Development Services Real Property Analyst Supervisor Delia Mejia and Administrative Aide Theresa Gardea.

Robert Torres spoke in opposition and spoke regarding the need for handicap and disabled accessibility in the project.

Stephen Rogers spoke in opposition and questioned the utility location.

Mark Nuaimi spoke in favor and encouraged the City to move forward on the project.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.  
The hearing was closed.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Council Member Roberts, seconded by Council Member Rutherford, and carried unanimously by vote of 4-0, to:

- (1) Make the following findings as described in the written staff report:
    - (I) The public interest and necessity require the proposed project.
    - (II) The project is planned or located in a manner that will be most compatible with the greatest public good and the least private injury.
    - (III) The real property to be acquired is necessary for the project.
    - (IV) The offers of just compensation have been made to the property owner.
  - (2) Adopt **Resolution No. 2010-101** , a Resolution of Necessity by the City Council of the City of Fontana, declaring the acquisition of fee, permanent utility, and temporary construction easement interests in portions of certain real property located in the City of Fontana, San Bernardino County, California, more particularly described as Assessor Parcel Numbers: 0251-121-30 and 0251-121-32, by Eminent Domain is necessary for the construction of the Citrus Avenue/Interstate 10 Interchange Project, in the City of Fontana, San Bernardino County, California.
- C) Hearing was opened to consider an amendment to the Landscaping and Water Conservation Ordinance.

No other written communications were received.

Staff presentation was given by Community Development Don Williams and Project Planner Arely Monarez.

Grace Wen spoke opposition and regarding a local parkscape replaced with concrete in her residential neighborhood.

Mayor Scialdone commented that the parkscape replacement was due to the American Disabilities Act which required accommodation and accessibility for a handicap neighbor.

Anne Knickerbocker requested clarification on the proposed amendment and also requested clarification on the water usage of City water features.



Mayor Scialdone referred Ms. Knickerbocker's to Community Development Director Don Williams and Public Works Director Chuck Hays who may assist with her questions.

City Manager Hunt commented on the circulated-water use of City fountains that conserves water.

No one else spoke in favor or opposition.  
The hearing was closed.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Warren, seconded by Council Member Roberts, and carried unanimously by vote of 4-0, to:

- (1) Determine that the project is Categorically Exempt pursuant to Section 15307 (Class 7, Actions by Regulatory Agencies for Protection of Natural Resources) of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption.
  - (2) Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1625**, an ordinance of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, approving an amendment to Chapter 28, Article IV, of the Municipal Code, and an amendment to Chapter 30, Article X, of the Zoning and Development Code, and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.
  - (3) Adopt **Resolution No. 2010-102** of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, approving the establishment of user fees for the appeal process referenced in Chapter 28, Article IV, of the Municipal Code.
- D) Hearing was opened to consider General Plan Amendment No. 09-011, Zone Change No. 09-006, and Agreement No. 10-0001.

Mayor Scialdone announced that staff has requested the hearing to remain open and to be continued to the October 27, 2010, Regular City Council Meeting.

No written communication was received.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Council Member Roberts, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Warren, and carried unanimously by vote of 4-0, to continue the hearing to the October 27, 2010, Regular City Council Meeting and to leave the hearing open.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:** None.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

- A) Discussion was held to consider the possible cancellation of the November 24, 2010, and December 22, 2010, Regular City Council Meetings.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Warren, seconded by Council Member Rutherford, and carried unanimously by vote of 4-0, to cancel the November 24, 2010, and December 22, 2010, Regular City Council Meetings.

City Manager Hunt commented on the anticipation of a Special City Council Meeting that may be needed after the November Election results and following the December 8, 2010, Regular Council Meeting.

**ELECTED OFFICIALS COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS:**

Mayor Pro Tem Warren spoke regarding the City and Redevelopment Agency's healthy budget, the recent Senior Center Project, the State's taking of \$33 million in Redevelopment funds, and the need for members of the public to research the City's finances.

Mayor Pro Tem Warren spoke regarding the notification of the August 27, 2010, Adjourned Regular City Council Meeting and the staff direction provided to work on opportunities for job creation and gateways to the City.

Mayor Pro Tem Warren commented the Council appointment process, her employment as a Deputy Public Works Director for the City of Upland, her service as Council Member for the City, and the election process in years 2004, 2006, and 2008.

Mayor Pro Tem Warren thanked Kaiser High School and students for the opportunity to participate in "Rachel's Challenge," an essay contest to support the chain reaction of kindness and elimination of school violence following the Columbine High School attack.

Mayor Pro Tem Warren encouraged residents to attend The Fight for Air Walk to take place on Saturday, October 2, 2010, at Fontana Park located at 15556 Summit Avenue, from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. Mayor Pro Tem Warren also encouraged residents to join the Healthy Fontana Team and find activities and events in the Community Services Activity Guide or by visiting [www.fontana.org](http://www.fontana.org).

Council Member Rutherford spoke regarding misinformation from the public comment period held earlier, the appointment process for Council Members and opportunity for public participation, and the criticism that comes with public service. Council Member Rutherford also reminded residents of the voter registration deadline that is fast approaching.

Council Member Rutherford announced her attendance at the League of California Cities Annual Conference held at the San Diego Convention Center from September 15-17, 2010, and the opportunity her and her colleagues had to learn communication strategies, organization tips, and to meet with local agencies.

Council Member Rutherford reminded residents to visit the Mary Vagle Nature Center for National Public Lands Day to be held on Saturday, September 25, 2010, at 11501 Cypress Avenue from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Council Member Rutherford commended the Community Services Department and staff for an outstanding "Play Day" held on September 18, 2010, at Veteran's Park.

Council Member Roberts announced his attendance at the League of California Cities Annual Conference held at the San Diego Convention Center from September 15-17, 2010, and the great opportunity to learn the perspectives of other local cities.

Council Member Roberts commented on tonight's public speakers and his retirement as County Fire Chief eight years ago.

Council Member Roberts announced his attendance at the Phase III Beam Raising held at Fontana Chaffey College and the great opportunity for education.

Council Member Roberts congratulated the City for its second naming as one of the nation's 100 Best Communities for Young People and commented on the great and recent special recognitions of local Softball Team that exemplify the City's support of its youth.

Council Member Roberts announced his attendance at the State Assemblymember Wilmer Amina Carter 30 Under 30 Recognition Event of Latinos and Native Americans held on Saturday, September 18, 2010. The City of Fontana had two great honorees: Elsie Hernandez of the Chamber of Commerce and Valerie Herrera of the City Clerk's Office.

Council Member Roberts thanked Kaiser High School and students for the opportunity to participate in a very moving "Rachel's Challenge" and the great encouragement for kindness inspiration in the City's youth.

Council Member Roberts commended former Mayor Mark Nuaimi at his attendance at this evening's and many other Council Meetings despite his full-time position and long commute.

Mayor Scialdone commented on the appointment process for City Council Members and the detailed applications that featured 20 questions.

Mayor Scialdone thanked Kaiser High School and students for the opportunity to participate in "Rachel's Challenge and the great support and opportunities of the City's youth.

Mayor Scialdone commented of the City's healthy financial performance and support of local projects that include Fire Station 71 remodel, the Police Department building remodel, and the Duncan Canyon Interchange Project.

Mayor Scialdone announced his attendance along with Council Member Roberts at the State Assemblymember Wilmer Amina Carter 30 Under 30 Recognition Event of Latinos and Native Americans held on Saturday, September 18, 2010, and congratulated Elsie Hernandez of the Chamber of Commerce and Valerie Herrera of the City Clerk's Office for being honored.

Mayor Scialdone announced his attendance at the Fontana Chaffey College Phase III Beam Raising on September 22, 2010, and the great academic building to come, as well as his attendance at Chaffey College's Constitution event on September 20, 2010, that featured panel discussion of the affects of local cities.

Mayor Scialdone announced the great and upcoming Saturday events that include the Mary Vagle Nature Center National Public Lands Day, Memorial Monument Unveiling at Green Acres, and The Fight for Air Walk at Fontana Park.

Mayor Scialdone encouraged residents to attend the City and Fontana School Board Candidate Forums being held by the Chamber of Commerce at City Hall in the Council Chamber at 7:00 p.m. on September 30, October 7, and October 14, 2010.

Mayor Scialdone commented on the 2009 FBI Crime Statistics and recent Sun newspaper article announcing Fontana with a 2.3 percent crime reduction and the City with the third lowest crime rate per thousand of the 12 local cities, with Rancho Cucamonga and Yucaipa in first and second place. The City's holistic approach to crime included focus on education, recreation programs, crime prevention through environmental design, and partnerships with the Fontana Unified School District in the After School Program and the new FLIP Program. With an After School Program at every elementary and middle school in the City, the City is dedicated to its youth and preventing problems before they occur.

**CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS:**


