**A. Regular City Council Meeting**

The Regular Meeting of the City of Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, April 12, 2011, in the City Council Chambers located at 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. Mayor Warren called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m.

**ROLL CALL:**

Present: Mayor Warren and Council Members Roberts, Slowik, Tahan, and Wibert.

Absent: None.

**INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Following the Invocation given by Pilgrim's Progress Church Pastor Enrique Mulgado, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Warren.

**CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT:**

City Attorney Clark Alsop announced the City Council had met in closed session

with no reportable action taken.

## **PROCLAMATIONS:**

### **A. Child Abuse Prevention Month**

Mayor Warren introduced San Bernardino County Children and Family Services Supervising Social Service Practitioners Hugo Castellanos and Linda Revoner and Proclaimed April 2011 as Child Abuse Prevention Month on behalf of the City of Fontana City Council.

Mr. Castellanos encouraged residents to call 211 to report and stop child abuse.

Mayor Warren thanked San Bernardino County Children and Family Services for their support of the safety of our children.

## **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

### **A. Cans for Cash Recognition**

Mayor Warren introduced Public Works Environmental Control Technician Scott Bruckner who presented a \$5,000 check to the Mayor and City Council from the U.S. Conference of Mayors Cans for Cash City Recycling Challenge Competition in which the City of Fontana won First Place in the category for Most Cans Collected.

Mayor Warren presented a Certificate of Recognition to the Public Works Department's Environmental Control Division for their great efforts in the U.S. Conference of Mayors Cans for Cash City Recycling Challenge and for their encouragement of community recycling.

### **B. Recognition of CIF Southern California Regional Champions**

Mayor Warren and the City Council congratulated the Summit High School Skyhawks Basketball Team, who became the first basketball team in Fontana Unified School District history to capture a CIF Southern Regional Championship and advance to the State Championship game. The Skyhawks finished with a 28-8 record, runner-up finish in the State Championship game, and have won the Sunkist League title for three consecutive years. These remarkable accomplishments happened within just five years of Summit High School's opening. Mayor Warren and the City Council announced their pride in the Skyhawks' accomplishments and of their representation of this great City.

## **PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:**

### **B. Accept San Manuel Charitable Giving Program Grant**

Community Services Director Garth Nelson commented on the San Manuel Band of Mission Indians' support of the preservation of the Mary Vagle Museum and Nature Center and the use of grant funds for upgrades to physical structures that will enhance programs and services offered at the Center. A presentation in thanks for San Manuel's grant funding will be forthcoming. Director Nelson also thanked Community Services Coordinator II Rick Dean for his great assistance at the Center.

Council Member Wibert commented on her excitement of the proposed improvements and use of grant funds at the Center. Council Member Wibert also thanked Rick Dean for a great job at the Center.

Council Member Slowik commented on the nature education and youth benefits that this facility allows for in our City. Council Member Slowik thanked San Manuel for their support of the Center.

Mayor Warren encouraged residents to attend the Center with their children. The Center is located at 11501 Cypress Avenue, is open Wednesday through Sunday from 12-5 p.m., and more information can be found at [www.fontana.org](http://www.fontana.org).

Council Member Roberts requested a status update on the completion of the eastern portions of the trail.

City Engineer Ricardo Sandoval commented on the Summer 2011 completion status of the eastern end of the trail and partnerships to complete the portions of the trail with neighboring jurisdictions following the City's completion.

Council Member Slowik thanked staff for installation of a street light at Mango Avenue and the trail due to community requests and to improve school children safety in the area.

City Engineer Sandoval commented on an upcoming follow-up project to install eight flashing beacons throughout the trail with completion expected this Summer.

City Clerk Lewis announced that one letter was received in support of staff recommendations but which mentioned concern for a more timely acceptance of the project.

Raymond Herrera spoke in support of Homeland Security and regarding a request to invest in license checkpoints for the City.

Mayor Warren requested clarification on the use of Homeland Security grant funds.

Police Chief Rod Jones commented that the funds recommended for acceptance this evening would be used on an approved list of equipment by the County which includes the proposed purchase a tactical vest, light sources, first aid kit, robot camera, portable handheld radios, equipment trailer, portable crime scene privacy screens, and evidence cameras.

## **CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS:**


### **A. City Manager Communications**


City Manager Hunt also clarified that he encourages City staff to be involved in the community and to represent the City well.
