**A. 7:00 P.M. Call the meeting to order**

The Regular Meeting of the City of Fontana City Council was held on Tuesday, June 14, 2011, in the City Hall Council Chambers, 8353 Sierra Avenue, Fontana, California. Mayor Warren called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m.

**ROLL CALL:**

**INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:**

Following the Invocation given by Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Council Member Tahan.

**CLOSED SESSION ANNOUNCEMENT:**

City Attorney Jeffrey Ballinger announced that the City Council had met in closed session for labor negotiations and reached final agreement with the POA, PMA, City Hall, the Yard, and Management Confidential Bargaining Units.

**SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS:**

**A. California Parks and Recreation Society Recognitions**

Mayor Warren introduced Community Services Supervisor Michael Wright who introduced video presentations to highlight the California Parks and Recreation Society (CPRS) Award Recipients. The CPRS District 11 Layman Award was presented to Fontana Unified School District Board President Barbara L. Chavez and Assistant Superintendent Oscar Duenas. Ralph Silva spoke regarding weed abatement billing, the breakdown of costs for property owners, and communication with the City regarding the billing for his property at 6612 Oak Street.

Mayor Warren referred Mr. Silva's questions to Police Department staff present.

Danny Marquez spoke regarding Veterans Community Programs and upcoming golf tournaments and fundraising events.

Yolanda Calderon spoke regarding zoning near 16462 Washington Drive and the effects of restricted parking signs, semi-truck traffic, and dangerous traffic conditions in the neighborhood due to semi-truck traffic.

## **CONSENT CALENDAR:**

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Council Member Tahan, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Roberts, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0, to approve Consent Calendar Items "A-P," with brief staff reports presented for Items B and I, and a brief comment from Council Member Slowik on Item E.

### **A. Approval of Minutes**

Approve the Minutes of the May 4, 2011, Adjourned Regular Joint City Council/Planning Commission Meeting, the May 10, 2011, Regular City Council Meeting, and the May 18, 2011, Special City Council Meeting.

### **B. Approve Amendment No. 1 to Contractual Agreement with Action Park Alliance, Inc.**

Approve Amendment No. 1 to the contractual agreement with Action Park Alliance, Inc.; including an annual decrease in expenditures and a matching decrease in the estimated revenues in the amount \$90,000 to provide programs and supervision at the Jack Bulik Skate Park and the Fontana Park Skate Park; and authorize the City Manager or his designee to sign the amendment and all related documents for the remaining term of the contract.

#### Staff Report:

Community Services Department Director Garth Nelson and Manager Frances Hernandez provided a brief staff report.

Community Services Supervisor Rafael Gonzales and Mark Lowry of Action Park Alliance, Inc., were also present.

Community Services Manager Hernandez commented that no concerts would be part of this proposed agreement and staffing adjustments will remain consistent with appropriate ratios.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on membership totals.

Community Services Manager Hernandez commented that current totals are from Fiscal Year 2009-2010 and new totals will be available soon. Membership totals are also tracked to distinguish attendance of non-residents versus residents. Cuts to times the skate parks are open will have minimal impacts to service.

Council Member Wibert requested the City skate parks to be closed during school hours.

**C. Fontana Art Association General Cooperative Programming Agreement**

Authorize the renewal of an agreement with the Fontana Art Association to offer cultural art programming at the Koehler Gallery and authorize the City Manager to execute any documents necessary to effectuate said agreement.

**D. Fontana Art Association Quarterly Report**

Receive and order filed the Fontana Art Association Quarterly Report.

**E. Adopt the San Bernardino County Non-Motorized Transportation Plan**

Adopt **Resolution No. 2011-037** of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, adopting the 2011 San Bernardino County Non-Motorized Transportation Plan.

Comment:

Council Member Slowik commented on the Healthy Communities Meeting he attended yesterday and commented on the Master Parks Plan and Non-Motorized Transportation Plan allow the City to move forward with healthy community efforts.

**F. Adopt a Resolution Amending Resolution No. 2010-098 revising the Fiscal Year 2010/2011 Measure I Local Street Program**

Adopt **Resolution No. 2011-038** of the City Council of the City of Fontana, Amending Resolution No. 2010-098 revising the Fiscal Year 2010/2011 Measure I Local Street Program.

**G. Authorize an Agreement with the County of San Bernardino for the Almeria Avenue Storm Drain Improvement Project**

Authorize the City Manager to execute an Agreement with the County of San Bernardino for design and construction of the Almeria Avenue Storm Drain Improvement Project.

**H. Award a Construction Contract for the Beech, Summit, Citrus, and Sierra Lakes Parkway Fiber Optic Network Project**

Authorize the City Manager to execute a construction contract with Crosstown Electrical & Data Inc. for the construction of the Beech, Summit, Citrus, and Sierra Lakes Parkway Fiber Optic Network Project in the amount of \$174,096.20 and authorize a 10 percent contingency in the amount of \$17,409.62. **I. Final Acceptance of the Foothill Boulevard Street Improvement Project**

Accept as complete the work performed by All American Asphalt for the Foothill Boulevard Street Improvement Project between Cherry Avenue and Hemlock Avenue; approve the final construction amount of \$4,130,570.50; and authorize the City Engineer to execute and file the Notice of Completion. (Bid No. SB-08-DE-10)

Staff Report:

Engineering Department Director Ricardo Sandoval and Senior Engineer Noel Castillo provided the staff report.

Council Member Tahan request clarification on the completion of the repairs east of Foothill Boulevard.

Senior Engineer Castillo commented on the segments near completion, challenges with other segments, and grant funding being located for the segment from Hemlock to Almeria Avenues.

Council Member Slowik requested clarification on the segment between Sierra and Almeria Avenues in regards to pavement rehabilitation.

Senior Engineer Castillo commented that the upcoming fiscal year budget will include pavement rehabilitation in this area and in other needed areas.

Engineering Department Director Sandoval explained challenges in the some of the segments.

Council Member Slowik commented on the dramatic improvements to this area over the years.

**J. Final Acceptance of the Storm Damage Repairs for the Interstate-10/Citrus Avenue Interchange**

Accept as complete the work performed by Laird Construction Company for the storm damage repairs for the I-10/Citrus Avenue Interchange; approve the final construction amount of \$185,150.00; and authorize the City Engineer to execute and file the Notice of Completion.

Approve Animal Housing Services Agreement with the City of San Bernardino for the term commencing on July 1, 2011 and terminating on June 30, 2014.

**M. Award Bid for Graffiti Paint and Supplies, SB-41-PW-11**

Award Bid for a two-year period with Frazee Industries, with three one-year extensions at the sole discretion of the City, for graffiti paint and supplies.

**N. Award Bid for CDBG Pavement Rehabilitation Project, SB-51-PW-11**

(1) Award Bid and authorize the City Manager to enter into a Contract with Matich Corporation for the construction of CDBG Pavement Rehabilitation, Project SB-51-PW-11 in the amount of \$1,064,000 and authorize a 10 percent contingency in

the amount of \$106,400.

(2) Authorize the Public Works Director to administratively approve and implement short term street closures and detours during construction.

**O. Award Bid for HVAC Full Service Maintenance and Replacement, SP-53-PW-11**

Award Bid and authorize the City Manager to enter into a Contract with Allison Mechanical, Inc., for HVAC Full Service Maintenance and Replacement, for a period of two years, renewable for three additional one-year increments at the sole discretion of the City of Fontana.

**P. Final Acceptance of Slover Avenue Pavement Rehabilitation Project SB-47-PW-10**

(1) Accept as complete and authorize the Director of Public Works to execute and file a Notice of Completion for Project SB-47-PW-10.

(2) Approve the final construction amount of \$1,123,369.40.

(3) Approve the release of the 10 percent retention upon satisfactory closure of the contract.

**PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

**A. Hearing was opened to consider construction of 46 affordable apartment units and land use change from General Commercial to Medium Density Residential (GPA 11-001, ZC 11-001, TPM 19313, DR 11-001) on the northeast corner Valley Blvd. and Cypress Ave.**

Associate Planner DiTanyon Johnson and Principal Planner Craig Bruonton provided the staff report.

No written communications were received.

Council Member Tahan commented on similar successful projects and requested clarification on the street width with regards to the first two phases.

Associate Planner Johnson commented that the improvements for Phase III will match Phases I and II.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on whether this project is funded by Fontana Redevelopment Agency funds for low-income housing.

City Manager Hunt commented that this project is partially funded by the Fontana Redevelopment Agency and 20 percent of those funds are set aside for low-income housing.

Council Member Tahan commented that this project is a good example of importance of the Fontana Redevelopment Agency and quality low-income development.

Council Member Slowik echoed Council Member Tahan's comments that this project is an excellent example of Fontana Redevelopment Agency funding and City requirements to meet low-income housing needs.

Deputy City Manager David Edgar commented on the three phase project development, Fontana Housing Authority goals for slum and blight removal and to raise the bar for affordable low-income housing.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on the total number of units.

Deputy City Manager David Edgar commented that there are approximately 142 units total from all phases.

Council Member Tahan requested street width minimums within the project.

Associate Planner Johnson commented that the minimum street width requirement of 26 feet is being met and in some cases the street width is 30 feet in project.

Council Member Slowik commented on the excellent design of the project.

No written communications were received.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

**ACTION:** Motion was made by Council Member Slowik, seconded by Council Member Wibert, and passed unanimously by a vote of 5-0 to:

(1) Find that the project will not have a significant effect on the environment; adopt a Negative Declaration, and direct staff to file a Notice of Determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act.

(2) Adopt **Resolution No. 2011-044** approving General Plan Amendment No. 11-001, amending the General Plan Land Use Map to change the general plan land use designation on approximately 7.2 acres of property (APNs: 0251-061-07, -08, -12, -15, -18, -20, -22, -25, -28 through -30, and -35) from General Commercial (C-G) to Medium Density Residential (R-M).

(3) Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1631** of the City of Fontana approving Zone Change No. 11-001, changing the Zoning District Map to change approximately 7.2 acres of property (APNs: 0251-061-07, -08, -12, -15, -18, -20, -22, -25, -28 through -30, and -35) from General Commercial (C-2) to Medium Density Residential (R-2); and that the reading of the title constitutes the first reading thereof.

(4) Approve Tentative Parcel Map No. 19313 and Design Review No. 11-001, subject to the findings and conditions of approval.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

### **A. Remote Caller Bingo Ordinance**



Police Chief Rod Jones provided the staff report.

No written communications were received.

Ron Rovere spoke regarding concerns for remote caller bingo which included payout amounts and verification of bingo number calling.

Danny Marquez spoke in support of remote caller bingo and the community give-back benefits.

Doyle Tolbert spoke in support of remote caller bingo due to the benefits to the non-profits that join.

Council Member Tahan requested clarification on the use of proceeds by non-profit organizations.

Police Chief Jones commented that the proceeds must be used for charitable purposes by the non-profit organizations and the organization must report this to the IRS, California Gaming Commission, and City. The City also has the ability to audit the financial records.

Council Member Tahan commented on the concern for how non-profits will use the funds since funds will exceed the normal limitations for traditional games.

Police Chief Jones commented that the Penal Code does allow for much higher prizes with 37.5 percent of the gross take of the game.

Mayor Warren commented on the need for full and accurate records due to State mandated audits, fines for violations, and whistleblower notifications.

Council Member Slowik requested clarification on the location licensing and land use permit requirements at the number calling and playing locations in relation to the ability to track locations, especially during transmission issues.

Police Chief Jones commented that the number calling and playing locations must be licensed and permitted, just as with traditional bingo gaming.

No one spoke in favor or opposition.

(1) Waive further reading of and introduce **Ordinance No. 1632** of the City Council of the City of Fontana, amending Article VII of Chapter 15 of the Fontana Municipal Code regarding Traditional and Remote Caller Bingo to add Section 15-279 related to Remote Caller Bingo.

(2) Adopt **Resolution No. 2011-045** of the City Council of the City of Fontana, California, setting the license fee for Remote Caller Bingo per Section 15-43 of the Fontana Municipal Code.

## **B. FUSD Contract for After School Program**

Discussion was held regarding the Fontana Unified School District (FUSD) contract for the After School Program.

City Manager Hunt commented that FUSD receives grant funding that it earmarked for use in annual after school programs with the City of Fontana and the Boys and Girls Club. FUSD met on June 9, 2011, in a special meeting and approved the contract to continue the programming. This item was listed on the agenda to await FUSD consideration and decision on the matter. The City Council's consideration of the City After School Program contract will be listed on a forthcoming agenda.

Mayor Warren commented that the program is on track.

## **CITY MANAGER COMMUNICATIONS:**

### **A. City Manager Communications**

City Manager Hunt thanked all City employee bargaining units that established negotiations agreements with the City and commented on tomorrow's State budget deadline. City Manager Hunt also commented on his meetings with City employee groups earlier this year and on the significant commitment by City employees to work with the City Council to find budget solutions by voluntarily cutting salaries, reforming pensions, and forgoing raises over multiple years and top to bottom.

City Manager Hunt thanked Interim Human Resources Director Annette Henckel for a great job over the past 18 months.

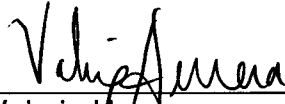
City Manager Hunt commented on the adjournment to the Budget Meeting on June 20, 2011, and request the City Council to submit any questions to staff.

Mayor Warren thanked City Manager Hunt and staff for a job well done.

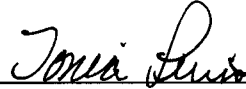
## **ADJOURNMENT:**
