

January 2021 Roll-Call Briefing Training

AUTISM RECOGNITION & RESPONSE

January's training topic is on Autism. Recognizing common autism characteristics can help officers rule out defiance or under the influence traits that officers typically conclude are the reason for a person's actions. This training is designed to help prepare officers to make a more informed, professional, and helpful response.

People on the autism spectrum can display recognizable indicators that may mirror someone under the influence or defiant. Unfortunately, as you'll see in some videos, due to a lack of training and/or recognition, officers react as a default as if someone is resisting/hiding something.
