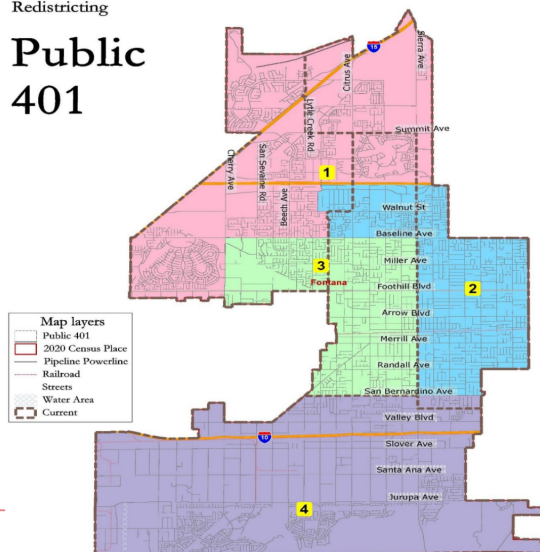

Map 401 keeps communities of interest together, based on shopping centers, commuting routes, schools, and demographics. District 1, keeps North Fontana together including the North-West which shares the same schools and shopping centers on Summit and by the 210 freeway. District 2 keeps the East side of the Fontana together, which includes Walnut Village and other communities that attend the same churches, schools and shopping centers. District 3 encompasses the West of Fontana which is close to the unincorporated area of Fontana and includes some rural areas, again sharing the same schools and shopping centers including the downtown area. District 4 includes all of the South of Fontana, including communities who have been impacted by the influx of warehousing, railyards, and other industries which result in numerous indirect sources of pollution such as diesel trucks which is affecting the health of the community and those nearby. District 4 shares the same schools, commuting routes such as the 10fwy.

For the many reasons mentioned above, the residents of Fontana, social justice groups, and community advocates, urges this city council to adopt this community map to comply with the law, based on population, Voting Rights Act, contiguity, and Community of Interest testimony.
