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Redistricting Process Recap

Step	Description
Two Initial Hearings October 12 & October 26	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the communities in the Districts.
Census Data Release Mid/Late August	Census Bureau releases official 2020 Census population data.
California Data Release Early October 2021	California Statewide Database releases California's official 'prisoner-adjusted' 2020 redistricting data.
Two Draft Map Hearings January 25 & March 8	Two Public Hearings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
Map Selection March 22	Public hearing followed by Council selection of a map.
Final Adoption April 12	Council formal adoption of selected map by resolution.
Map Adoption By April 17, 2022	Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption. Map adopted via ordinance.*

Redistricting Rules and Goals

1. Federal Laws

Equal Population

Federal Voting Rights Act

No Racial Gerrymandering



2. California Criteria for Cities (rank ordered)

1. Geographically contiguous
2. Undivided neighborhoods and “communities of interest”
(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
3. Easily identifiable boundaries
4. Compact
(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

Prohibited:

“Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party.”

3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles


Minimize voters shifted to different election years

Respect voters’ choices / continuity in office


Future population growth

Public Map Submissions








Council-Selected Focus Maps

Demographic Summary

□ Population Balance

- Maps 101 – 104b and 401 – 403 are all population balanced, with plan deviations ranging from 0.11% to 5.94%. All are well below the 10% maximum deviation considered “presumptively constitutional.”

□ Voting Rights Act compliance

- The current map has three Latino-majority districts and a Latino-plurality District 1
- Maps 101 – 104b and 401 – 403 all at least preserve those numbers
