











## Sewer Improvement Plans

1. Access Sewer Improvement Plans by clicking on the following link:  
[City of Fontana Improvement Plans \(arcgis.com\)](https://arcgis.com)
2. From this page, you will click on the “Sewer” text found at the top of the screen.
3. From this page, you will want to find your project site. This can be done in two ways:
  - a. **Option 1:** On the top right of the page, below the blue banner, you will see an icon with a magnifying glass . Click on the magnifying glass , and you can search for your site by address.
  - b. **Option 2:** Clicking and dragging on the map until you find your project site.
4. Different color lines may appear in front of your site. Access the legend by clicking the layer symbol  on the top right of the screen and then clicking the “Legend” tab. Here you can see what the different colored lines and symbols represent. (If you do not see anything in the legend/layers, you may need to zoom in closer on the map.)
5. If there are no lines or symbols present along the street in front of your site, there is no City Sewer Line in front of your site.
6. To access the City Sewer Plans, you will need to locate the nearest  icon.
7. Click on the  icon and a window will pop up. To access the plans, click on the plan number after “Link to document:”
8. The plans will open in a separate window where you can print the plan to PDF to save for your records.

\*Please be advised, if you are clicking on the  icon and an additional window is not popping up, ensure that the point of your arrow/cursor is within the blue box of the icon.

\*\*There may be multiple plans that contain your project site. If you do not find what you are looking for in the current plan, you may need to look at another sewer plan in the area.




## Storm Drain Improvement Plans

1. Access Storm Drain Improvement Plans by clicking on the following link:

2. From this page, you will click on the “Storm View” text found at the top of the screen.
3. From this page, you will want to find your project site. This can be done in two ways:
  - a. **Option 1:** On the top right of the page, below the blue banner, you will see an icon with a magnifying glass . Click on the magnifying glass , and you can search for your site by address.
  - b. **Option 2:** Clicking and dragging on the map until you find your project site.

4. The blue line on the map represents the City Storm Drain Line. If there is no blue line present on the street in front of your site, there is no City Storm Drain Line in front of your site.
5. To access the City Storm Drain Plans, click directly on the blue line. A window will pop up. To access the plans, click on the plan number after “Link to document:”
6. The plans will open in a separate window where you can print the plan to PDF to save for your records.

\*Please be advised, if you are clicking on the line and an additional window is not popping up, ensure that the point of your arrow/cursor is within the blue line.

## Street Improvement Plans

1. Access Street Improvement Plans by clicking on the following link:

2. From this page, you will click on the “Street Improvements” text found at the top of the screen.
3. From this page, you will want to find your project site. This can be done in two ways:
  - a. **Option 1:** On the top right of the page, below the blue banner, you will see an icon with a magnifying glass . Click on the magnifying glass , and you can search for your site by address.
  - b. **Option 2:** Clicking and dragging on the map until you find your project site.
4. Different color lines may appear in front of your site. Access the legend by clicking the layer symbol  on the top right of the screen and then clicking the “Legend” tab. Here you can see what the different colored lines and symbols mean. (If you do not see anything in the legend/layers, you may need to zoom in closer on the map.)
5. If there are no lines present along the street in front of your site, there are no plans in front of your site.
6. To view the improvement plans, click on the corresponding line. This will open an additional window.
7. Within the window, click on the plan number after “Link to document:”
8. The plans will open in a separate window where you can print the plan to PDF to save for your records.

\*Please be advised, if you are clicking on the line or symbol and an additional window is not popping up, ensure that the point of your arrow/cursor is within the line or symbol.
