The City of Fontana's Economic Development Department aims to create an environment where the business community can grow and succeed while strengthening the Fontana economy.

The Fontana Municipal Code requires all businesses operating within City limits to be properly licensed and in accordance with the standards for zoning (via Planning Department), Building and Safety, and Public Health.

Obtaining Your Fontana Business License

Depending on your business type or industry, this process may vary. Using a home address for your business? Please apply in-person at Fontana City Hall, 8353 Sierra Avenue between Monday – Thursday from 8 am – 5 pm.

Steps for obtaining a business license

- 1 Starting your application online at www.fontanaca.gov and pay applicable fees.
- 2 Once your application is received, it is reviewed by different departments like
 - > Planning for zoning compliance*
 - > Building and Safety for building regulations*
 - > Public Health**
 - > Police Department**
- 3 You'll receive feedback and address any concerns raised by City departments.
- 4 After successful completion of inspections and approvals from City departments, your applications forwarded to the Business License division for final processing and issuance.

Frequently asked questions

Who do I contact for a list of commercial and industrial sites that are available in the City of Fontana?

> You will need to find a broker with commercial and industrial listings in the City of Fontana and work with them for any dealings related to property. We are unable to recommend a specific broker to you.

What do I do to start my business once I find a piece of property?

> Before you purchase the property, you'll want to find out the land use and zoning designation. If you need assistance, you can contact Planning.

What is the process to get my plans approved to construct my building?

> We suggest you connect with Marketing & Economic Development Manager, Monique Carter, who can help give you initial feedback on your project and any prerequisites before the development process.

> You will need to find an architect/engineer. We are unable to recommend a specific architect/engineer to you. In addition, you will need to check for the architect's and engineer's licensing.

KEY TERMS

Land use refers to the way a property is used. Larger categories are residential, commercial, industrial, and public uses. Land use can also be more specific, like retail sales or single-family residential.

Zoning is a set of rules that state which land uses can go in which areas and how properties can be developed.
